A BILL

To abolish the death penalty under Federal law.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Federal Death Penalty
5 Abolition Act of 2023”.

6 **SEC. 2. REPEAL OF FEDERAL LAWS PROVIDING FOR THE**

7 **DEATH PENALTY.**

8 **SEC. 3. PROHIBITION ON IMPOSITION OF DEATH SENTENCE.**

10 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provision
11 of law, no person may be sentenced to death or put
12 to death on or after the date of enactment of this Act
13 for any violation of Federal law.

14 (b) PERSONS SENTENCED BEFORE DATE OF ENACT-
15 MENT.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any
16 person sentenced to death before the date of enactment
17 of this Act for any violation of Federal law shall be resen-
18 tenced.
