3 SECTION 1. ESTABLISHMENT OF NATIONAL CEMETERY IN

THE SARPY COUNTY REGION.

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Veterans Affairs6 shall establish, in accordance with chapter 24 of title 38,

United States Code, a national cemetery in the Sarpy
 County region to serve the needs of veterans and their
 families.

4 (b) CONSULTATION IN SELECTION OF SITE.—Before
5 selecting the site for the national cemetery established
6 under subsection (a), the Secretary shall consult with—

7 (1) appropriate officials of the State of Ne8 braska and local officials in the Sarpy County re9 gion; and

(2) appropriate officials of the Federal Government, including the Administrator of General Services, with respect to land belonging to the Federal
Government in that area that would be suitable to
establish the national cemetery under subsection (a).
(c) AUTHORITY TO ACCEPT DONATION OF PARCEL
OF LAND.—

17 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Veterans
18 Affairs may accept on behalf of the United States
19 the gift of an appropriate parcel of real property.
20 The Secretary shall have administrative jurisdiction
21 over such parcel of real property, and shall use such
22 parcel to establish the national cemetery under sub23 section (a).

24 (2) INCOME TAX TREATMENT OF GIFT.—For
25 purposes of Federal income, estate, and gift taxes,

the real property accepted under paragraph (1) shall
 be considered as a gift to the United States.

3 (d) REPORT.—As soon as practicable after the date 4 of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall submit 5 to Congress a report on the establishment of the national 6 cemetery under subsection (a). The report shall set forth 7 a schedule for such establishment and an estimate of the 8 costs associated with such establishment.

9 (e) SARPY COUNTY REGION DEFINED.—In this Act,
10 the term "Sarpy County region" means the geographic
11 area consisting of—

12 (1) Knox, Antelope, Boone, Nance, Merrick, 13 Hamilton, Clay, Nuckolls, Thayer, Fillmore, York, 14 Polk, Platte, Madison, Pierce, Cedar, Wayne, Stan-15 ton, Colfax, Butler, Seward, Saline, Jefferson, Gage, 16 Lancaster, Saunders, Dodge, Cuming, Thurston, 17 Dixon, Dakota, Burt, Washington, Douglas, Sarpy, 18 Cass, Otoe, Johnson, Nemaha, Pawnee, and Rich-19 ardson counties in the State of Nebraska;

(2) Lyon, Sioux, Plymouth, Woodbury, Monona,
Harrison, Pottawatomie, Mills, Fremont, Osceola,
Dickinson, O'Brien, Clay, Cherokee, Buena Vista,
Ida, Sac, Crawford, Carroll, Shelby, Audubon, Guthrie, Cass, Adair, Montgomery, Adams, Union, Page,

Taylor, and Ringgold counties in the State of Iowa;
 and

3 (3) Atchison, Holt, Buchanan, Platte, Clay,
4 Clinton, Dekalb, Andrew, Nodaway, Worth, and
5 Gentry counties in the State of Missouri.
