- 1 (b) Report.—Not later than 180 days after the date
- 2 of enactment of this Act, the Comptroller General shall
- 3 submit to the Secretary of Homeland Security, the Com-
- 4 mittees on Homeland Security and Transportation and In-
- 5 frastructure of the House of Representatives and the Com-
- 6 mittee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs
- 7 of the Senate a report containing the findings of the re-
- 8 view conducted under subsection (a). The report shall in-
- 9 clude—
- 10 (1) an assessment of the feasibility and cost ef-
- 11 fectiveness of using Civil Air Patrol assets for the
- purposes described in subsection (a); and

- mechanisms for Federal agencies and States to re-
