AN ACT

To authorize the Secretary of Health and Human Services, acting through the Director of the Center for Mental Health Services of the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, to award grants to implement innovative approaches to securing prompt access to appropriate follow-on care for individuals who experience an acute mental health episode and present for care in an emergency department, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Improving Mental3 Health Access from the Emergency Department Act of4 2021".

5 SEC. 2. SECURING APPROPRIATE FOLLOW-ON CARE FOR 6 ACUTE MENTAL HEALTH ILLNESS AFTER AN 7 EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT ENCOUNTER.

8 The Public Health Service Act is amended by insert9 ing after section 520J of such Act (42 U.S.C. 290bb-31)
10 the following new section:

11 "SEC. 520J-1. SECURING APPROPRIATE FOLLOW-ON CARE

12 FOR ACUTE MENTAL HEALTH ILLNESS AFTER 13 AN EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT ENCOUNTER.

14 "(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary may award grants 15 on a competitive basis to qualifying health providers to 16 implement innovative approaches to securing prompt ac-17 cess to appropriate follow-on care for individuals who ex-18 perience an acute mental health episode and present for 19 care in an emergency department.

20 "(b) ELIGIBLE GRANT RECIPIENTS.—In this section,
21 the term 'qualifying health provider' means a health care
22 facility licensed under applicable law that—

23 "(1) has an emergency department;

24 "(2) is staffed by medical personnel (such as
25 emergency physicians, psychiatrists, psychiatric reg26 istered nurses, mental health technicians, clinical so-

cial workers, psychologists, and therapists) capable
 of providing treatment focused on stabilizing acute
 mental health conditions and assisting patients to
 access resources to continue treatment in the least
 restrictive appropriate setting; and

6 "(3) has arrangements in place with other pro7 viders of care that can provide a full range of medi8 cally appropriate, evidence-based services for the
9 treatment of acute mental health episodes.

10 "(c) USE OF FUNDS.—A qualifying health provider 11 receiving funds under this section shall use such funds to 12 create, support, or expand programs or projects intended to assist individuals who are treated at the provider's 13 14 emergency department for acute mental health episodes 15 and to expeditiously transition such individuals to an appropriate facility or setting for follow-on care. Such use 16 17 of funds may support the following:

18 "(1) Expediting placement in appropriate facili-19 ties through activities such as expanded coordination 20 with regional service providers, assessment, peer 21 navigators, bed availability tracking and manage-22 ment, transfer protocol development, networking in-23 frastructure development, and transportation serv-24 ices. "(2) Increasing the supply of inpatient psy chiatric beds and alternative care settings such as
 regional emergency psychiatric facilities.

4 "(3) Use of alternative approaches to providing
5 psychiatric care in the emergency department set6 ting, including through tele-psychiatric support and
7 other remote psychiatric consultation, implementa8 tion of peak period crisis clinics, or creation of psy9 chiatric emergency service units.

"(4) Use of approaches that include proactive
followup such as telephone check-ins, telemedicine,
or other technology-based outreach to individuals
during the period of transition.

14 "(5) Such other activities as are determined by
15 the Secretary to be appropriate, consistent with sub16 section (a).

"(d) APPLICATION.—A qualifying health provider desiring a grant under this section shall prepare and submit
an application to the Secretary at such time and in such
manner as the Secretary may require. At a minimum, the
application shall include the following:

"(1) A description of identified need for acute
mental health services in the provider's service area.
"(2) A description of the existing efforts of the
provider to meet the need for acute mental health

1	services in the service area, and identified gaps in
2	the provision of such services.
3	"(3) A description of the proposed use of funds
4	to meet the need and gaps identified pursuant to
5	paragraph (2).
6	"(4) A description of how the provider will co-
7	ordinate efforts with Federal, State, local, and pri-
8	vate entities within the service area.
9	((5) A description of program objectives, how
10	the objectives are proposed to be met, and how the
11	provider will evaluate outcomes relative to objectives.
12	"(e) Authorization of Appropriations.—To
13	carry out this section, there is authorized to be appro-
14	priated \$15,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2022 through
15	2026.".
