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## A BILL

To replace the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases with 3 separate national research institutes.

- 1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
- 2       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**
- 3       This Act may be cited as the “NIH Reform Act”.

1   **SEC. 2. DIVISION OF NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF ALLERGY**

2                   **AND INFECTIOUS DISEASES.**

3       (a) ORGANIZATION OF NATIONAL RESEARCH INSTI-  
4       TUTES.—Section 401 of the Public Health Service Act (42  
5       U.S.C. 281) is amended—

6                   (1) in subsection (b)—

7                      (A) in paragraph (6), by striking “Allergy  
8                      and Infectious Diseases” and inserting “Aller-  
9                      gic Diseases”;

10                  (B) by redesignating paragraph (25) as  
11                  paragraph (27); and

12                  (C) by inserting after paragraph (24) the  
13                  following:

14                  “(25) The National Institute of Infectious Dis-  
15                  eases.

16                  “(26) The National Institute of Immunologic  
17                  Diseases.”; and

18                  (2) in subsection (d)(1), by striking “27” and  
19                  inserting “29”.

20                  (b) APPOINTMENT OF DIRECTORS.—

21                  (1) IN GENERAL.—Section 405(a)(1) of the  
22                  Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 284(a)(1)) is  
23                  amended—

24                  (A) by inserting “, the Director of the Na-  
25                  tional Institute of Allergic Diseases, the Direc-  
26                  tor of the National Institute of Infectious Dis-

1           eases, and the Director of the National Insti-  
2           tute of Immunologic Diseases” after “National  
3           Cancer Institute”; and

4                 (B) by inserting “by and with the advice  
5                 and consent of the Senate,” after “the Presi-  
6                 dent.”.

7                 (2) TERMS.—Section 405(a) of the Public  
8                 Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 284(a)) is amended  
9                 by adding at the end the following:

10                 “(4) CERTAIN APPOINTMENTS BY THE PRESI-  
11                 DENT.—The appointments by the President of the  
12                 Director of the National Institute of Allergic Dis-  
13                 eases, the Director of the National Institute of In-  
14                 fectious Diseases, and the Director of the National  
15                 Institute of Immunologic Diseases shall be for terms  
16                 of 5 years. Each such Director may be reappointed  
17                 for not more than 1 additional term, in accordance  
18                 paragraph (1).”.

19                 (3) TRANSITION.—Effective on the date of en-  
20                 actment of this Act, the position of Director of the  
21                 National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases  
22                 is terminated, and the National Institute of Allergic  
23                 Diseases, the National Institute of Infectious Dis-  
24                 eases, and the National Institute of Immunologic  
25                 Diseases shall be overseen by the Director of the

1       National Institutes of Health until such time as the  
2       directors of each such national institutes is ap-  
3       pointed pursuant to section 405(a)(1) of the Public  
4       Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 284(a)(1)), as  
5       amended by paragraph (1).

6       (c) DUTIES OF THE NATIONAL INSTITUTES.—

7               (1) NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF ALLERGIC DIS-  
8       EASES.—Subpart 6 of part C of title IV of the Pub-  
9       lic Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 285f et seq.) is  
10      amended—

11               (A) in the subpart heading, by striking  
12       **“Allergy and Infectious Diseases”** and  
13       inserting **“Allergic Diseases”**; and

14               (B) in section 446—

15               (i) by striking “Allergy and Infectious  
16       Diseases” and inserting “Allergic Dis-  
17       eases”; and

18               (ii) by striking “allergic and  
19       immunologic diseases and disorders and in-  
20       fectious diseases, including tropical dis-  
21       eases” and inserting “allergic diseases and  
22       disorders”.

23               (2) NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF INFECTIOUS DIS-  
24       EASES.—

## **7 SEC. 464z-10. PURPOSE OF THE INSTITUTE.**

8        “The general purpose of the National Institute of In-  
9 fectionous Diseases is the conduct and support of research,  
10 training, health information dissemination, and other pro-  
11 grams with respect to infectious diseases, including trop-  
12 ical diseases.”.

(B) TRANSFER OF AUTHORITIES.—Section 447A and 447B of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 285f-2; 285f-3) are—

16 (i) redesignated as sections 464z–11  
17 and 464–12, respectively; and

## **16 “SEC. 464z-15. PURPOSE OF THE INSTITUTE.**

17        “The general purpose of the National Institute of  
18 Immunologic Diseases is the conduct and support of re-  
19 search, training, health information dissemination, and  
20 other programs with respect to immunologic diseases and  
21 disorders.”.

(B) TRANSFER OF AUTHORITIES.—Sections 447 and 447C of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 285f-1; 285f-4) are—

(C) ORDERLY TRANSITION.—The Director of the National Institutes of Health shall take such steps as are necessary to provide for the orderly transition to the authority of the National Institute of Immunologic Diseases established under section 464z–15 of the Public Health Service Act, as added by subparagraph (A), from any authority related to immunologic diseases and disorders of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases, as in effect on the day before the date of enactment of this Act.

18 (d) CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—

19                         (1) Section 404B of the Public Health Service  
20                         Act (42 U.S.C. 283d) is amended by striking “Na-  
21                         tional Institute for Allergy and Infectious Diseases”  
22                         and inserting “National Institute for Infectious Dis-  
23                         eases”.

1                             (A) in subsection (a)(1), by striking “or  
2                             the Director of the National Institute for Al-  
3                             lergy and Infectious Diseases”; and

4                             (B) by striking “or the National Institute  
5                             for Allergy and Infectious Diseases” each place  
6                             it appears.

7                             (3) Section 442A(a) of the Public Health Serv-  
8                             ice Act (42 U.S.C. 285d-8(a)) is amended by strik-  
9                             ing “Allergy and Infectious Diseases” and inserting  
10                             “Immunologic Diseases”.

11                             (4) Any reference in any law (including a regu-  
12                             lation), guidance, map, document, record, or other  
13                             paper of the United States to the National Institute  
14                             of Allergy and Infectious Diseases, including with re-  
15                             spect to the Director of such Institute, shall be  
16                             deemed to be a reference to, as applicable, the Na-  
17                             tional Institute of Allergic Diseases, the National In-  
18                             stitute of Infectious Diseases, or the National Insti-  
19                             tute of Immunologic Diseases, including with respect  
20                             to the Directors of such Institutes.
