A BILL

To revise the Uniform Crime Reports, and the National Incident-Based Reporting System, to direct the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation to include information in those reports pertaining to law enforcement-involved justifiable homicides, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Collection and Analysis
5 of Data to Educate and Train Law Enforcement Officers
6 Act of 2015” or the “CADET Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. REPORTING OF USE OF FORCE BY OR AGAINST LAW**
2 **ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Director of the Federal Bu-
4 reau of Investigation shall revise the Uniform Crime Re-
5 ports and the National Incident-Based Reporting System
6 to include information in those reports pertaining to the
7 justified and unjustified uses of force resulting in death
8 or injury by or against law enforcement officers, including
9 the following information on such a use of force:

10 (1) The age, race, gender, religion, criminal his-
11 tory, if any, of the victim.

12 (2) The age, race, gender of the officer involved
13 in the homicide, and other relevant information re-
14 lating to the officer involved such as the number of
15 prior officer involved shootings and uses of lethal
16 force, number and disposition of citizen complaints
17 (formal and informal) filed against the officer and
18 the nature and description of any disciplinary ac-
19 tions taken against the officer.

20 (b) DEFINITION.—For purposes of this section, the
21 term “Uniform Crime Reports” means the reports author-
22 ized under section 534 of title 28, United States Code,
23 and administered by the Federal Bureau of Investigation
24 which compiles nationwide criminal statistics for use in
25 law enforcement administration, operation, and manage-

1 ment and to assess the nature and type of crime in the
2 United States.

3 (c) GRANT REDUCED.—In the case of a State or unit
4 of local government that receives a grant award under
5 subpart 1 of part E of title I of the Omnibus Crime Con-
6 trol and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. 3750 et
7 seq.), if that State or unit of local government fails sub-
8 stantially to provide the information required under sub-
9 section (a), the Attorney General shall reduce the amount
10 that would otherwise be awarded to that State or unit of
11 local government under such grant program in the fol-
12 lowing fiscal year by an amount not less than 10 percent
13 nor more than 25 percent.

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
