Ms. UNDERWOOD (for herself and Mr. GALLAGHER) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Agriculture

A BILL

To amend the Food Security Act of 1985 to provide for the establishment of climate change mitigation bundles, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Farmers Fighting Cli-
5 mate Change Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. CLIMATE CHANGE MITIGATION BUNDLES.**

7 (a) DEFINITIONS.—Section 1240I(2)(B)(v) of the
8 Food Security Act of 1985 (16 U.S.C. 3839aa-
9 21(2)(B)(v)) is amended by inserting “climate change
10 and” before “increasing weather volatility”.

1 (b) RANKING OF APPLICATIONS.—Section
2 1240K(b)(1)(A) of the Food Security Act of 1985 (16
3 U.S.C. 3839aa–23(b)(1)(A)) is amended—

4 (1) in clause (ii), by striking “; and” and in-
5 serting a semicolon;

6 (2) by redesignating clause (iii) as clause (iv);
7 and

8 (3) by inserting after clause (ii) the following:

9 “(iii) the degree to which the com-
10 bination of the benefits described in
11 clauses (i) and (ii) effectively target in-
12 creases in carbon sequestration or net re-
13 ductions in greenhouse gas emissions;
14 and”.

15 (c) IN GENERAL.—Section 1240L of the Food Secu-
16 rity Act of 1985 (16 U.S.C. 3839aa–24) is amended by
17 adding at the end the following:

18 “(m) ESTABLISHMENT OF CLIMATE CHANGE MITI-
19 GATION BUNDLES.—

20 “(1) AVAILABILITY.—In entering into conserva-
21 tion stewardship contracts under section 1240K, the
22 Secretary shall make State- or region-specific cli-
23 mate change mitigation bundles available to pro-
24 ducers in all regions of the country, including by
25 making available climate change mitigation bundles

1 appropriate to cropland, pastureland, rangeland, and
2 forest land.

3 “(2) FLEXIBILITY.—In designing climate
4 change mitigation bundles under this subsection, the
5 Secretary shall, to the maximum extent practicable,
6 allow producers to select from among conservation
7 activities meeting the requirements of paragraph
8 (3)(A) in order to tailor a climate change mitigation
9 bundle to the site-specific needs of the producer.

10 “(3) CLIMATE CHANGE MITIGATION BUNDLE
11 DEFINED.—In this subsection, the term ‘climate
12 change mitigation bundle’ means a grouping of con-
13 servation activities determined by the Secretary,
14 based on the best available science, to achieve sub-
15 stantial progress, when carried out together, to-
16 ward—

17 “(A) providing a net reduction of green-
18 house gas emissions; or

19 “(B) increasing carbon sequestration and
20 improving soil health.”.

21 (d) REPORT.—

22 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 2 years after
23 the first date on which climate change bundles are
24 made available to producers pursuant to section
25 1240L(m) of the Food Security Act of 1985 (as

1 added by this Act), the Secretary of Agriculture
2 shall submit to the Committee on Agriculture of the
3 House of Representatives and the Committee on Ag-
4 riculture, Nutrition, and Forestry of the Senate a
5 report on the activities carried out under such sec-
6 tion.

7 (2) CONTENTS.—The Secretary shall include in
8 the report submitted under paragraph (1)—

9 (A) a summary of feedback, from pro-
10 ducers that have adopted climate change miti-
11 gation bundles pursuant to such section
12 1240L(m), regarding barriers to adoption of
13 such bundles, the makeup of such bundles, pay-
14 ment rates for such bundles, technical assist-
15 ance relating to such bundles, and other rel-
16 evant information;

17 (B) data on such producers, disaggregated
18 by gender, race, age, and congressional district;

19 (C) an assessment of barriers to the adop-
20 tion by producers of climate change mitigation
21 bundles, as identified by the Secretary; and

22 (D) recommendations on steps to increase
23 the adoption of climate change mitigation bun-
24 dles by producers, including recommendations

1 for any statutory changes necessary to imple-
2 ment such steps.

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
