#### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may be cited as the "Sea Turtle Rescue As					
3	sistance and Rehabilitation Act of 2023".					
4	SEC. 2. SEA TURTLE RESCUE ASSISTANCE AND REHABILI					
5	TATION GRANT PROGRAM.					
6	(a) Establishment.—The Secretary shall establish					
7	a grant program, to be known as the "Sea Turtle Rescue					
8	Assistance and Rehabilitation Grant Program", to encour-					
9	age and facilitate coordinated rapid response and rescue					
10	by awarding grants for the purposes described in sub-					
11	section (e).					
12	(b) Designation of Stranding and Rehabilita-					
13	TION REGIONS.—The Secretary shall designate geographic					
14	regions of the United States as stranding and rehabilita-					
15	tion regions for the purposes of carrying out this section.					
16	(c) Purposes.—The purposes of the Program are to					
17	provide for—					
18	(1) the recovery, short- or long-term care,					
19	transportation, and treatment of stranded marine					

- 21 (2) the release of rescued and recovered marine 22 turtles;
- 23 (3) the collection of data and samples from 24 stranded marine turtles for scientific research re-25 lated to marine turtle health; and

1	(4) facility operation costs that are directly re-					
2	lated to activities described in paragraphs (1), (2)					
3	and (3).					
4	(d) Equitable Distribution of Funds.—The					
5	Secretary shall ensure, to the extent practicable, that					
6	funds awarded under this section are distributed equitable					
7	among stranding and rehabilitation regions, taking into					
8	account—					
9	(1) the number of stranding and rehabilitation					
10	events that occurred in each stranding and rehabili-					
11	tation region in the preceding 5 years; and					
12	(2) the conservation priorities and recovery					
13	needs of species of marine turtles that are threat-					
14	ened or endangered under the Endangered Species					
15	Act of 1973 (16 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.).					
16	(e) APPLICATION.—An applicant for a grant under					
17	this section shall submit an application in such form and					
18	manner as the Secretary shall prescribe.					
19	(f) Grant Criteria.—					
20	(1) DEVELOPMENT OF CRITERIA.—The Sec-					
21	retary shall, in consultation with the Director of the					
22	United States Fish and Wildlife Service, establish by					
23	regulation appropriate criteria for awarding grants

under this section.

- (2) STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT.—As part of the process for developing and finalizing criteria under paragraph (1), the Secretary shall, in consultation with the Director of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service, provide opportunities for engagement with representatives from stranding and rehabilitation regions and representatives of State governments and public and private organizations with an established record in coordination, rescue, rehabilitation, and release, as well as related scientific research, marine conservation, and forensic science, with respect to stranded marine turtles.
  - (3) REQUIRED CRITERIA.—The criteria developed under paragraph (1) shall prioritize applicants with an established record of coordination, rescuing, rehabilitation, scientific research, and forensic science with respect to stranded and rehabilitated marine turtles or conducting scientific research and forensic science on stranded and rehabilitated marine turtles.

#### (g) Limitations.—

(1) MAXIMUM AMOUNT OF GRANT.—No grant awarded under this section may exceed \$150,000 in any 12-month period.

1	(2) MATCHING REQUIREMENT.—The non-Fed-						
2	eral share of the costs of an activity conducted with						
3	a grant awarded under the Program shall be not less						
4	than 50 percent of such costs, including in-kind						
5	services and the use of property.						
6	(h) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:						
7	(1) Marine turtle.—The term "marine tur-						
8	tle" means any member of the family Cheloniidae or						
9	Dermochelyidae.						
10	(2) Program.—The term "Program" means						
11	the Sea Turtle Rescue Assistance and Rehabilitation						
12	Grant Program established under subsection (a).						
13	(3) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means						
14	the Secretary of Commerce.						
15	(4) Stranding.—The term "stranding" means						
16	an event in which—						
17	(A) a marine turtle is dead and is—						
18	(i) on a beach or shore of the United						
19	States; or						
20	(ii) in waters under the jurisdiction of						
21	the United States (including any navigable						
22	waters); or						
23	(B) a marine turtle is alive and is—						
24	(i) on a beach or shore of the United						
25	States and unable to return to the water.						

1	(ii) on a beach or shore of the United						
2	States and in need of medical attention; or						
3	(iii) in waters under the jurisdiction						
4	of the United States (including any navi-						
5	gable waters), and in need of medical at						
6	tention or other necessary intervention to						
7	aid its likelihood of survival.						
8	(5) Stranding and rehabilitation re-						
9	GION.—The term "stranding and rehabilitation re-						
10	gion" means a geographic region designated by the						
11	Secretary under subsection (b).
