Mr. SANTOS introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To require reports on the immigration status of individuals convicted of State crimes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Secure Our Border
5 and Our Streets Act of 2023”.

6 **SEC. 2. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS RELATED TO THE IM-**
7 **MIGRATION STATUS OF INDIVIDUALS CON-**
8 **VICTED OF CRIMES.**

9 (a) **REQUIREMENT FOR STATE CRIMES.**—Beginning
10 in the first fiscal year that begins after the date of enact-

1 ment of this Act, in order to be eligible to receive Federal
2 funds from the Department of Justice, a State shall—

3 (1) document the immigration status of each in-
4 dividual arrested in that State; and

5 (2) submit to the Attorney General, on an an-
6 nual basis, information on the immigration status of
7 each individual convicted of a crime under the laws
8 of the State during the previous fiscal year.

9 (b) REPORT.—Not later than the end of the first fis-
10 cal year that begins after the date of enactment of this
11 Act and annually thereafter, the Attorney General shall
12 submit to Congress a report that contains the information
13 reported to the Attorney General under subsection (a).
