A BILL

To establish in the Department of Veterans Affairs a pilot program instituting a clinical observation program for pre-med students preparing to attend medical school.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 *This Act may be cited as the “Veterans-Specific Edu-*
5 *cation for Tomorrow’s Health Professionals Act” or the “Vet*
6 *HP Act”.*

7 **SEC. 2. SENSE OF CONGRESS REGARDING DEPARTMENT OF**
8 **VETERANS AFFAIRS PILOT PROGRAM FOR**
9 **CLINICAL OBSERVATION BY UNDER-**
10 **GRADUATE STUDENTS.**

11 *It is the sense of Congress that the pilot program de-*
12 *scribed in section 3(a) should be designed to—*

13 (1) *increase the awareness, knowledge, and em-*
14 *pathy of future health professionals toward the health*
15 *conditions common to veterans;*

16 (2) *increase the diversity of the recruitment pool*
17 *of future physicians of the Department; and*

18 (3) *expand clinical observation opportunities for*
19 *all students by encouraging students of all back-*
20 *grounds to consider a career in the health professions.*

21 **SEC. 3. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS PILOT PRO-**
22 **GRAM FOR CLINICAL OBSERVATION BY UN-**
23 **DERGRADUATE STUDENTS.**

24 (a) *ESTABLISHMENT.—The Secretary of Veterans Af-*
25 *fairs shall carry out a pilot program for a one-year period,*

1 beginning not later than August 15, 2021, to provide cer-
2 tain students described in subsection (d) a clinical observa-
3 tion experience at medical centers of the Department of Vet-
4 erans Affairs.

5 (b) MEDICAL CENTER SELECTION.—The Secretary
6 shall carry out the pilot program under this section at not
7 fewer than five medical centers of the Department. In select-
8 ing such medical centers, the Secretary shall ensure regional
9 diversity among such selected medical centers.

10 (c) CLINICAL OBSERVATION SESSIONS.—

11 (1) FREQUENCY AND DURATION.—In carrying
12 out the pilot program, the Secretary shall—

13 (A) provide at least one and not more than
14 three clinical observation sessions at each med-
15 ical center selected during each calendar year;

16 (B) ensure that each clinical observation
17 session—

18 (i) lasts between four and six months;
19 and

20 (ii) to the extent practicable, begins
21 and ends concurrently with one or more
22 academic terms of an institution of higher
23 education (as defined in section 101 of the
24 Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C.
25 1001)); and

1 (C) ensure that the clinical observation ses-
2 sions provided at a medical center have minimal
3 overlap.

4 (2) SESSIONS.—The Secretary shall ensure that
5 the pilot program consists of clinical observation ses-
6 sions as follows:

7 (A) Each session shall allow for not fewer
8 than five students nor greater than 15 students
9 to participate in the session.

10 (B) Each session shall consist of not fewer
11 than 20 observational hours nor greater than 40
12 observational hours.

13 (C) A majority of the observational hours
14 shall be spent observing a health professional.
15 The other observational hours shall be spent in
16 a manner that ensures a robust, well rounded ex-
17 perience that exposes the students to a variety of
18 aspects of medical care and health care adminis-
19 tration.

20 (D) Each session shall provide a diverse
21 clinical observation experience.

22 (d) STUDENTS.—

23 (1) SELECTION.—The Secretary shall select to
24 participate in the pilot program under subsection (a)
25 students who are—

1 (A) nationals of the United States;
2 (B) enrolled in an accredited program of
3 study at an institution of higher education; and
4 (C) referred by their institution of higher
5 education following an internal application
6 process.

7 (2) *PRIORITY.*—In making such selection, the
8 Secretary shall give priority to each of the following
9 five categories of students:

10 (A) Students who, at the time of the comple-
11 tion of their secondary education, resided in a
12 health professional shortage area (as defined in
13 section 332 of the Public Health Service Act (42
14 U.S.C. 254e)).

15 (B) First generation college students (as de-
16 fined in section 402A(h)(3) of the Higher Edu-
17 cation Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1067q(a))).

18 (C) Students who have been referred by mi-
19 nority-serving institutions (as defined in section
20 371(a) of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20
21 U.S.C. 1067q(a))).

22 (D) Veterans (as defined in section 101 of
23 title 38, United States Code).

24 (E) Students who indicate an intention to
25 specialize in a health professional occupation

1 *identified by the Inspector General of the De-*
2 *partment under section 7412 of title 38, United*
3 *States Code, as having a staffing shortage.*

4 (3) *ASSIGNMENT TO MEDICAL CENTERS.—The*
5 *Secretary shall assign students selected under para-*
6 *graph (1) to medical centers selected under subsection*
7 *(b) without regard for whether such medical centers*
8 *have staffing shortages in any health professional oc-*
9 *cupation pursuant to section 7412 of title 38, United*
10 *States Code.*

11 (e) *OTHER MATTERS.—In carrying out the pilot pro-*
12 *gram under this section, the Secretary shall—*

13 (1) *establish a formal status to facilitate the ac-*
14 *cess to medical centers of the Department by student*
15 *observers participating in the pilot program;*

16 (2) *establish standardized legal, privacy, and*
17 *ethical requirements for the student observers, includ-*
18 *ing with respect to—*

19 (A) *ensuring that no student observer pro-*
20 *vides any care to patients while participating as*
21 *an observer; and*

22 (B) *ensuring the suitability of a student to*
23 *participate in the pilot program to ensure that*
24 *the student poses no risk to patients;*

1 (3) develop and implement a partnership strategy with minority-serving institutions to encourage
2 referrals;

4 (4) create standardized procedures for student
5 observers;

6 (5) create an online information page about the
7 pilot program on the internet website of the Department;
8

9 (6) publish on the online information page created
10 under paragraph (5) the locations of such centers,
11 and other information on the pilot program, not
12 later than 180 days before the date on which applica-
13 tions are required to be submitted by potential stu-
14 dent observers;

15 (7) identify medical centers and specific health
16 professionals participating in the pilot program; and

17 (8) notify the Committees on Veterans' Affairs of
18 the House of Representatives and the Senate of the
19 medical centers selected under subsection (c) within
20 30 days of selection, to facilitate program awareness.

21 (f) REPORT.—Not later than 180 days after the com-
22 pletion of the pilot program under subsection (a), the Sec-
23 retary shall submit to the Committees on Veterans' Affairs
24 of the House of Representatives and the Senate a report on
25 the results of the pilot program, including—

- 1 (1) the number and demographics of all appli-
2 cants, those accepted to participate in the pilot pro-
3 gram, and those who completed the pilot program;
4 and
5 (2) if participating institutions of higher edu-
6 cation choose to administer satisfaction surveys that
7 assess the experience of those who completed the pilot
8 program, the results of any such satisfaction surveys,
9 provided at the discretion of the institution of higher
10 education.

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
