# H. R. 3228

Mr. MURPHY of Connecticut introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce

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## A BILL

To reinstate and transfer certain hydroelectric licenses and extend the deadline for commencement of construction of certain hydroelectric projects in the Town of Canton, Connecticut.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Collinsville Renewable  
5       Energy Promotion Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. EXTENSION OF TIME AND REINSTATEMENT OF EX-**  
2 **PIRED LICENSES FOR FEDERAL ENERGY**  
3 **REGULATORY COMMISSION PROJECTS NUM-**  
4 **BERED 10822 AND 10823.**

5 Notwithstanding the time period specified in section  
6 13 of the Federal Power Act (16 U.S.C. 806) that would  
7 otherwise apply to the Federal Energy Regulatory Com-  
8 mission projects numbered 10822 and 10823, the Federal  
9 Energy Regulatory Commission (referred to in this Act  
10 as the “Commission”) shall, upon the enactment of this  
11 Act—

12 (1) reinstate the licenses effective as of the date  
13 of their termination; and

14 (2) extend the time period during which the li-  
15 censee is required to commence the construction of  
16 each project to and including February 23, 2011.

17 **SEC. 3. TRANSFER OF LICENSES TO THE TOWN OF CANTON,**  
18 **CONNECTICUT.**

19 Notwithstanding section 8 of the Federal Power Act  
20 (16 U.S.C. 801) or any other provision thereof, the Com-  
21 mission is directed to transfer the licenses for Federal En-  
22 ergy Regulatory Commission projects numbered 10822  
23 and 10823, without delay or the institution of any pro-  
24 ceedings, to the Town of Canton, Connecticut, not later  
25 than 30 days after the date of the enactment of this Act.
