### H. R. 4051

#### AN ACT

To direct the Secretary of Commerce to establish a task force regarding shark depredation, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may be cited as the "Supporting the Health				
3	of Aquatic systems through Research Knowledge and En-				
4	hanced Dialogue Act" or the "SHARKED Act".				
5	SEC. 2. SHARK DEPREDATION TASK FORCE AND RESEARCH				
6	PROJECTS.				
7	(a) Shark Depredation Task Force.—				
8	(1) In General.—The Secretary of Commerce				
9	shall establish a task force (referred to in this sub-				
10	section as the "task force") to identify and address				
11	critical needs with respect to shark depredation.				
12	(2) Membership.—The Secretary of Com-				
13	merce shall appoint individuals to the task force, in-				
14	cluding—				
15	(A) 1 representative from—				
16	(i) each Regional Fishery Manage-				
17	ment Council established under section				
18	302(a)(1) of the Magnuson-Stevens Fish-				
19	ery Conservation and Management Act (16				
20	U.S.C. 1852(a)(1));				
21	(ii) each Marine Fisheries Commis-				
22	sion, as such term is defined in section 3				
23	of the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Con-				
24	servation and Management Act (16 U.S.C.				
25	1802);				

1	(iii) the fish and wildlife agency of a
2	coastal State from each Regional Fishery
3	Management Council established under
4	section 302(a)(1) of the Magnuson-Stevens
5	Fishery Conservation and Management Act
6	(16 U.S.C. 1852(a)(1)); and
7	(iv) the National Marine Fisheries
8	Service;
9	(B) an individual with expertise in the
10	management of highly migratory species;
11	(C) a researcher with expertise in shark
12	management and behavior; and
13	(D) a researcher with expertise in shark
14	ecology.
15	(3) Responsibilities.—The task force shall—
16	(A) develop ways to improve coordination
17	and communication across the fisheries man-
18	agement community and shark research com-
19	munity to address shark depredation;
20	(B) identify research priorities and funding
21	opportunities for such priorities, including—
22	(i) identifying shark species involved
23	in interactions;
24	(ii) shark stock assessments;

1	(iii) how sharks become habituated to
2	humans and thus lead to more interactions
3	between sharks and humans;
4	(iv) how angler behavior and fishery
5	regulatory frameworks may influence shark
6	interactions;
7	(v) techniques and strategies to re-
8	duce harmful interactions between sharks
9	and humans, including the development
10	and use of non-lethal deterrents;
11	(vi) the role of healthy shark popu-
12	lations in the ocean food web; and
13	(vii) climate change impacts on shift-
14	ing shark populations, prey, and shark be-
15	havior;
16	(C) develop recommended management
17	strategies to address shark depredation; and
18	(D) coordinate the development and dis-
19	tribution of educational materials to help the
20	fishing community minimize shark interactions
21	including through changed angler behavior and
22	expectations.
23	(4) Report.—Not later than 2 years after the
24	date of the enactment of this section, and every 2
25	vears thereafter until the termination of the task

1	force in accordance with paragraph (5), the task
2	force shall submit to Congress a report regarding
3	the findings of the task force.
4	(5) Sunset.—The task force shall terminate
5	not later than 7 years after the date on which the
6	Secretary of Commerce establishes the task force.
7	(6) Coastal State Defined.—In this sub-
8	section, the term "coastal State"—
9	(A) means a State of the United States in,
10	or bordering on, the Atlantic Ocean, Pacific
11	Ocean, Arctic Ocean, Gulf of Mexico, or Long
12	Island Sound; and
13	(B) includes Puerto Rico, the Virgin Is-
14	lands of the United States, Guam, the Com-
15	monwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands,
16	and American Samoa.
17	(b) Shark Depredation Research Projects.—
18	Section 318(c) of the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Con-
19	servation and Management Act (16 U.S.C. 1867(c)) is
20	amended by adding at the end the following:
21	"(6) Projects to better understand shark depre-
22	dation, including identifying what causes increases
23	in shark depredation and determining how to best

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address shark depredation.".

- 1 (c) Effect.—Nothing in this Act shall be construed
- 2 to affect the authority and responsibility of the Secretary
- 3 of Commerce in carrying out the Endangered Species Act
- 4 of 1973 or the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation
- 5 and Management Act.
