A BILL

To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to provide for a minimum number of refugees who may be admitted in any fiscal year after fiscal year 2024, and for other purposes.

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Lady Liberty Act of
5 2023”.

1 **SEC. 2. MINIMUM NUMBER OF REFUGEES TO BE ADMITTED.**

2 Section 207(a) of the Immigration and Nationality
3 Act (8 U.S.C. 1157(a)) is amended by inserting after “in
4 any fiscal year after fiscal year 1982 shall be such number
5 as the President determines,” the following: “except that
6 in any fiscal year after fiscal year 2024, such number may
7 not be less than 125,000, without regard to whether or
8 not the President makes any determination”.
