## A BILL

To direct the Secretary of the Interior to issue a final decision whether or not to issue a permit under the Endangered Species Act of 1973 authorizing construction of an elementary school in San Diego, California.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Jonas Salk Elementary  
5       Cap Undo Regulatory Environmental Delay” or the  
6       “CURED Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. PERMIT AUTHORIZING CONSTRUCTION OF AN ELE-**  
2 **MENTARY SCHOOL IN SAN DIEGO, CALI-**  
3 **FORNIA.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of the Interior  
5 shall, by not later than the end of the 90-day period begin-  
6 ning on the date of enactment of this Act, issue a final  
7 decision whether or not to issue a permit under the En-  
8 dangered Species Act of 1973 (16 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.)  
9 authorizing the San Diego Unified School District to con-  
10 struct an elementary school in San Diego, California, in  
11 accordance with the document “October 2011, San Diego  
12 Unified School District, Final Environmental Impact Re-  
13 port for Jonas Salk Area Elementary School  
14 SCH#2010011021”, dated February 20, 2008, including  
15 the technical appendices to such document.

16 (b) PERMIT DEEMED ISSUED.—If the Secretary does  
17 not issue a final decision in accordance with subsection  
18 (a), such a permit is deemed to have been issued upon  
19 the expiration of the period referred to in subsection (a).
