A BILL

To terminate the COVID–19 vaccination requirement for aliens, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. TERMINATING COVID-19 VACCINATION RE-**
2 **QUIREMENT FOR ALIENS.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Beginning on the date of the en-
4 actment of this Act, the COVID-19 vaccination require-
5 ment for aliens shall have no force or effect.

6 (b) PROHIBITION ON FUNDING.—Beginning on the
7 date of the enactment of this Act, no Federal funds may
8 be used to administer, implement, or enforce the COVID-
9 19 vaccination requirement for aliens.

10 (c) DEFINITION.—In this Act, the term “COVID-19
11 vaccination requirement for aliens” means any require-
12 ment of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention
13 or the Department of Homeland Security, including pur-
14 suant to part G of title III of the Public Health Service
15 Act (42 U.S.C. 264 et seq.) or part 34 of subchapter C
16 of chapter I of title 42, Code of Federal Regulations,
17 that—

18 (1) an alien be vaccinated against COVID-19
19 as a condition of being issued a visa or entering the
20 United States;

21 (2) a nonimmigrant alien be vaccinated against
22 COVID-19 as a condition of adjusting status to that
23 of an alien lawfully admitted for permanent resi-
24 dence; or

25 (3) an alien lawfully admitted to the United
26 States for permanent residence be vaccinated

1 against COVID–19 as a condition of naturalizing as
2 a citizen of the United States.
