## A BILL

To provide for the withdrawal of the United States from the North American Free Trade Agreement.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. WITHDRAWAL OF THE UNITED STATES FROM
- 4 THE NAFTA.
- 5 (a) WITHDRAWAL OF APPROVAL.—Notwithstanding
- 6 any other provision of law, the approval of the NAFTA
- 7 by the Congress provided for in section 101(a) of the

- 1 North American Free Trade Agreement Implementation
- 2 Act shall cease to be effective beginning on the date that
- 3 is six months after the date of the enactment of this Act.
- 4 (b) Notification of Withdrawal.—On the date
- 5 of the enactment of this Act, the President shall provide
- 6 to the Governments of Canada and Mexico written notice
- 7 of withdrawal of the United States from the NAFTA in
- 8 accordance with Article 2205 of the NAFTA.
- 9 (c) NAFTA DEFINED.—In this section, the term
- 10 "NAFTA" means the North American Free Trade Agree-
- 11 ment entered into between the United States, Canada, and
- 12 Mexico on December 17, 1992.

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
