A BILL

To establish an interactive online dashboard to improve public access to information about grant funding related to mental health and substance use disorder programs.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the “Achieving Thorough
5 Transparency and Accessibility for Information Naviga-
6 tion on Mental Health Act of 2023” or the “ATTAIN
7 Mental Health Act”.

8 SEC. 2. INTERACTIVE DASHBOARD.

9 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—

ment, the Secretary of Labor, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, the Secretary of Defense, the Secretary of Homeland Security, and heads of other relevant agencies, as the Secretary determines appropriate;

(ii) Indian Tribes and Tribal organizations (as defined in section 4 of the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (25 U.S.C. 5304)); and

(iii) relevant entities who may use the dashboard, including—

(I) elementary or secondary

schools; institutions of higher education, including historically Black colleges and universities (as defined for purposes of section 322 of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1061), Tribal colleges or universities (as defined in section 316(b) of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1059c(b))), and other minority-serving institutions, as such institutions are described in section 371(a) of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1067q); local edu-

(II) any other entities that the Secretary determines are relevant.

21 (b) UPDATES.—The Secretary shall continually main-
22 tain the dashboard established under subsection (a) to
23 keep all relevant, current grant opportunities posted.

1 (c) REQUIREMENTS.—The dashboard established
2 under subsection (a) shall, at a minimum, meet the fol-
3 lowing requirements:

4 (1) Provide the following information:

5 (A) The name of each Federal grant pro-
6 gram and, if different, the name of each associ-
7 ated State grant program, as available, that is
8 designated for, or which allows an expenditure
9 for, activities for the purposes of mental health
10 or substance use disorder prevention, treat-
11 ment, recovery, or support.

12 (B) With respect to the current fiscal year,
13 for each program for which subgrants are not
14 available, indicate whether applications for the
15 Federal grant application period is open, closed
16 or awarded, and the opening, closing, and
17 award dates.

18 (C) For each program for which amounts
19 have been awarded to States for the current fis-
20 cal year with respect to a block grant described
21 in subsection (d)(2), include, as available,
22 whether the relevant application period for a
23 subgrant remains open, has closed, or been
24 awarded at the State level, and whether there
25 will be a new subgrant competition during the

1 current fiscal year, if such information is avail-
2 able from the applicable State in a manner that
3 allows for integration of such information into
4 the dashboard or for links to such information
5 within the dashboard.

6 (2) For purposes of assisting applicants in iden-
7 tifying programs included in the dashboard, include
8 the following information with respect to each pro-
9 gram listed:

10 (A) Any associated authorization, report,
11 appropriation, agency program, grant number,
12 or other information that the Secretary deter-
13 mines to be useful in identifying the program.

14 (B) Any subgrant name used by a State,
15 if different than the associated Federal pro-
16 gram, if known by the Secretary.

17 (3) Allow potential grant applicants to search
18 the dashboard by key categories and location, if ap-
19 plicable, for which grants are available.

20 (4) Provide, as appropriate, access or links to
21 the respective program information pages and online
22 applications.

23 (d) ACCEPTANCE AND INTEGRATION OF STATE PRO-
24 VIDED DATA.—

1 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary may determine how to accept and integrate into the dashboard information voluntarily submitted by States that is relevant to the purposes of such dashboard, as described subsection (a)(1).

6 (2) BLOCK GRANTS.—In the case of mental health and substance use disorder resources made available through Federal block grants to States and Indian Tribes and Tribal organizations (as defined in section 4 of the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (25 U.S.C. 5304)), or Federal funding for which a specific recipient is not identified prior to its distribution to a State or Indian Tribe or Tribal organization, the Secretary may establish a method for States and Indian Tribes and Tribal organizations to voluntarily identify how Federal grants will be or were distributed, including grant names and internet website links, if different.
