 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; DEFINITIONS.

- 4 (a) SHORT TITLE.—This Act may be cited as the
 5 "California Coastal National Monument Expansion Act of
 6 2012".
- 7 (b) DEFINITIONS.—In this Act:

1	(1) MONUMENT.—The term "Monument"
2	means the California Coastal National Monument
3	established by Presidential Proclamation 7264,
4	issued January 11, 2000.
5	(2) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
6	the Secretary of the Interior.
7	(3) MAP.—The term "map" means the map
8	created by the Bureau of Land Management, enti-
9	tled "California Coastal National Monument Addi-
10	tion" and dated April 23, 2012.
11	(4) POINT ARENA-STORNETTA PUBLIC
12	LANDS.—The term "Point Arena-Stornetta Public
13	Lands" means the Federal lands comprising ap-
14	proximately 1,255 acres in Mendocino County, Cali-
15	fornia, as generally depicted on the map titled "Cali-
16	fornia Coastal National Monument Addition" and
17	dated April 23, 2012.
18	SEC. 2. FINDINGS; PURPOSE.
19	(a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds as follows:
20	(1) The Point Arena-Stornetta Public Lands
21	contain significant natural resources, including im-
22	portant wildlife habitat, several riparian corridors,
23	extensive wetlands, ponds and other water sources,
24	cypress groves, meadows, and sand dunes that

should be preserved for present and future genera tions.

3 (2) The ocean and coastal ecosystems adjacent
4 to the Point Arena-Stornetta Public Lands are inter5 nationally recognized as significant centers of coastal
6 upwelling that support the diverse, abundant and
7 productive marine ecosystems and wildlife under8 lying the local economy and identity of coastal com9 munities.

10 (3) The Point Arena-Stornetta Public Lands
11 tell an important story about California's coastal
12 prehistory and history in the context of the sur13 rounding region and communities.

14 (4) The coastal area surrounding the Point
15 Arena-Stornetta Public Lands was traditionally used
16 by Indian people, including the Pomo Indian tribes.

17 (5) The Point Arena-Stornetta Public Lands
18 are historically associated with adjacent lands man19 aged for the enjoyment of current and future gen20 erations, including the Arena Rock Marine Natural
21 Preserve, and Manchester Beach State Park.

(6) The Point Arena-Stornetta Public Lands
represent a model partnership where future management can be successfully accomplished among the

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2	County, local communities, and private groups.
3	(7) Permanent protection of the Point Arena-
4	Stornetta Public Lands will provide important eco-
5	nomic benefits to surrounding communities, and has
6	broad public support.
7	(8) The Point Arena-Stornetta Public Lands
8	would make a significant addition to the California
9	Coastal National Monument and National Land-
10	scape Conservation System administered by the De-
11	partment of the Interior's Bureau of Land Manage-
12	ment.
13	(9) Statutory protection is needed for Point
14	Arena-Stornetta Public Lands to ensure that it re-
15	mains a part of our historic, cultural, and natural
16	heritage and a source of inspiration for the people
17	of the United States.
18	(b) PURPOSE.—The purpose of this Act is to protect,
19	conserve, and enhance for the benefit and enjoyment of
20	present and future generations the unique and nationally
21	important historical, natural, cultural, scientific, edu-
22	cational, scenic, and recreational values of the Point

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Federal Government, State of California, Mendocino

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The boundary of the California
4 Coastal National Monument, established by Presidential
5 Proclamation 7264, is expanded to include the Federal
6 land shown on the map. These lands shall be managed
7 under the provisions of Presidential Proclamation 7264.
8 (b) MAP AND LEGAL DESCRIPTION.—

9 (1) As soon as practicable after the date of the 10 enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall file with 11 the Committee on Natural Resources of the House 12 of Representatives and the Committee on Energy 13 and Natural Resources of the Senate a map and 14 boundary description of lands added to the Monu-15 ment by this Act.

16 (2) FORCE AND EFFECT.—The map and bound17 ary description filed under subsection (1) shall have
18 the same force and effect as if included in this sec19 tion, except that the Secretary may correct any
20 minor errors in the maps and boundary descriptions.

(3) AVAILABILITY OF MAP AND BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION.—The map and boundary description
filed under subsection (1) shall be on file and available for public inspection in appropriate offices of
the Bureau of Land Management.

1 SEC. 4. ADMINISTRATION.

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall manage these
3 lands as a part of the California Coastal National Monu4 ment established under the provisions of Presidential
5 Proclamation 7264.

(b) MANAGEMENT PLAN.—Not later than 2 years 6 7 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary 8 shall finalize an amendment to the Monument manage-9 ment for the long-term protection and management of the 10 lands added to the Monument by this Act. The plan amendment shall be developed with full public participa-11 12 tion and shall describe the appropriate uses and management of the lands consistent with this Act. 13

(c) MOTORIZED AND MECHANIZED TRANSPORT.—
15 Except as needed for emergency or authorized administra16 tive purposes, the use of motorized and mechanized vehi17 cles in the monument shall be permitted only on roads
18 and trails designated for their use.

19 (d) Incorporation of Lands and Interests.—

20 (1) AUTHORITY.—The Secretary may acquire
21 non-Federal land or interests in land within or adja22 cent to the lands added to the Monument by this
23 Act only through exchange, donation, or purchase
24 from a willing seller.

25 (2) MANAGEMENT.—Any lands or interests in
26 land within or adjacent to the lands added to the
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Monument by this Act acquired by the United States
 after the date of the enactment of this Act shall be
 added to and administered as part of the Monument.
 (e) OVERFLIGHTS.—Nothing in this Act shall be con 5 strued to—

6 (1) restrict or preclude overflights, including 7 low-level overflights, military, commercial, and gen-8 eral aviation overflights that can be seen or heard 9 within to the lands added to the Monument by this 10 Act;

(2) restrict or preclude the designation or creation of new units of special use airspace or the establishment of military flight training routes over to
the lands added to the Monument by this Act; or

(3) modify regulations governing low-level overflights above the adjacent Gulf of the Farallones National Marine Sanctuary.

(f) LAW ENFORCEMENT.—Nothing in this act effects
the Department of Homeland Security law enforcement
authorities.

(g) NATIVE AMERICAN USES.—Nothing in this act
enlarges or diminishes the rights of any Indian tribe or
Indian religious community.

24 (h) BUFFER ZONES.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—The expansion of the Monu ment is not intended to lead to the creation of pro tective perimeters or buffer zones around the lands
 included in the Monument by this Act.

5 (2) ACTIVITIES OUTSIDE THE MONUMENT.— 6 The fact that activities outside the Monument can 7 be seen or heard within the lands added to the 8 Monument by this Act shall not, of itself, preclude 9 such activities or uses up to the boundary of the 10 Monument.

(i) NATIONAL LANDSCAPE CONSERVATION SYSTEM.—The Secretary shall manage the Monument as part
of the National Landscape Conservation System.

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
