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## A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Agriculture to provide assistance in support of nurseries and seed orchards, to establish a grant program in support of nurseries and seed orchards, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*

2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Reforestation, Nurs-

5       eries, and Genetic Resources Support Act of 2023” or the

6       “RNGR Support Act of 2023”.

1     **SEC. 2. NURSERY AND SEED ORCHARD SUPPORT.**

2         (a) PARTNERSHIPS, COLLABORATION, AND OTHER  
3     ASSISTANCE IN SUPPORT OF NURSERIES AND SEED OR-  
4     CHARDS.—The Secretary of Agriculture, acting through  
5     the Chief of the Forest Service, shall—

6             (1) partner with Federal and State agencies,  
7     Indian Tribes, and private nurseries to provide  
8     training, technical assistance, and research to nurs-  
9     ery and tree establishment programs that support  
10   natural regeneration, reforestation, agroforestry, and  
11   afforestation;

12             (2) promote information sharing to improve  
13     technical knowledge and practices and understand  
14     demands, climate change impacts, and other issues  
15     as necessary to address all facets of the reforestation  
16     pipeline;

17             (3) provide technical and financial assistance to  
18     international nursery and tree establishment pro-  
19     grams through the Forest Service International Pro-  
20     grams, the Institute of Pacific Islands Forestry, and  
21     the International Institute of Tropical Forestry;

22             (4) collaborate with other relevant Federal de-  
23     partments and agencies, including the Foreign Agri-  
24     cultural Service of the Department of Agriculture,  
25     the United States Agency for International Develop-  
26     ment, the United States Fish and Wildlife Service of

1       the Department of the Interior, and international or-  
2       ganizations, including the Food and Agriculture Or-  
3       ganization of the United Nations, to provide tech-  
4       nical and financial assistance related to nurseries  
5       and reforestation;

6               (5) coordinate the efforts of the Department of  
7       Agriculture to—

8                       (A) address the challenges associated with  
9       the reforestation pipeline; and

10                      (B) leverage economic development assist-  
11       ance for work with private nurseries; and

12               (6) expand climate-informed reforestation sup-  
13       ply chains through science and research, seed collec-  
14       tion and storage, and nursery infrastructure and op-  
15       erations.

16       (b) NURSERY AND SEED ORCHARD GRANTS.—

17               (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 2 years after  
18       the date of enactment of this section, the Secretary  
19       of Agriculture shall establish a program to provide  
20       grants to eligible recipients to support nurseries and  
21       seed orchards.

22               (2) ELIGIBLE PROJECTS.—The Secretary may  
23       make a grant under this section to an eligible recipi-  
24       ent for a project to do at least one of the following:

1                             (A) Develop, expand, enhance, or improve  
2                             nursery production capacity or other infrastruc-  
3                             ture to—

- 4                                 (i) improve seed collection and stor-  
5                             age;  
6                                 (ii) increase seedling production, stor-  
7                             age, and distribution; or  
8                                 (iii) enhance seedling survival and  
9                             properly manage tree genetic resources.

10                            (B) Establish or expand a nursery or seed  
11                             orchard, including by acquiring equipment for  
12                             such nursery or seed orchard.

13                            (C) Develop or implement quality control  
14                             measures at nurseries or seed orchards.

15                            (D) Promote workforce development within  
16                             any facet of the reforestation pipeline.

17                            (E) Carry out such other activity as the  
18                             Secretary determines appropriate.

19                            (c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

20                            (1) ELIGIBLE RECIPIENT.—The term “eligible  
21                             recipient” means—

22                                 (A) a State forestry agency;

23                                 (B) an Indian Tribe; and

24                                 (C) a private nursery that has experience  
25                             growing high-quality native trees of appropriate

1           genetic sources in bareroot or container  
2           stocktypes specific for reforestation, restoration,  
3           or conservation, including native plants and  
4           seeds that are of cultural significance to Indian  
5           Tribes.

6           (2) NURSERY.—The term “nursery” means a  
7           tree or native plant nursery.

8           (3) SEED ORCHARD.—The term “seed orchard”  
9           means a tree or native plant seed orchard.

10          (4) STATE.—The term “State” means each of  
11          the several States, the District of Columbia, the  
12          Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, and any territory or  
13          possession of the United States.

14          (d) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is  
15          authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section  
16          \$25,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2024 through 2028.
