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## A BILL

To provide a temporary extension of certain programs, and  
for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Protecting Against  
3 Indebting our Descendants through Fully Offset Relief  
4 (PAID FOR) Temporary Extension Act of 2010”.

5 **SEC. 2. EXTENSION OF UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE PRO-**  
6 **VISIONS.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—(1) Section 4007 of the Supple-  
8 mental Appropriations Act, 2008 (Public Law 110–252;  
9 26 U.S.C. 3304 note) is amended—

10 (A) by striking “June 2, 2010” each place  
11 it appears and inserting “July 7, 2010”;

12 (B) in the heading for subsection (b)(2),  
13 by striking “JUNE 2, 2010” and inserting “JULY  
14 7, 2010”; and

15 (C) in subsection (b)(3), by striking “No-  
16 vember 6, 2010” and inserting “December 11,  
17 2010”.

18 (2) Section 2002(e) of the Assistance for Un-  
19 employed Workers and Struggling Families Act, as  
20 contained in Public Law 111–5 (26 U.S.C. 3304  
21 note; 123 Stat. 438), is amended—

22 (A) in paragraph (1)(B), by striking “June  
23 2, 2010” and inserting “July 7, 2010”;

24 (B) in the heading for paragraph (2), by  
25 striking “JUNE 2, 2010” and inserting “JULY 7,  
26 2010”; and

1 (C) in paragraph (3), by striking “Decem-  
2 ber 7, 2010” and inserting “January 11,  
3 2011”.

4 (3) Section 2005 of the Assistance for Unem-  
5 ployed Workers and Struggling Families Act, as con-  
6 tained in Public Law 111–5 (26 U.S.C. 3304 note;  
7 123 Stat. 444), is amended—

8 (A) by striking “June 2, 2010” each place  
9 it appears and inserting “July 7, 2010”; and

10 (B) in subsection (c), by striking “Novem-  
11 ber 6, 2010” and inserting “December 11,  
12 2010”.

13 (4) Section 5 of the Unemployment Compensa-  
14 tion Extension Act of 2008 (Public Law 110–449;  
15 26 U.S.C. 3304 note) is amended by striking “No-  
16 vember 6, 2010” and inserting “December 11,  
17 2010”.

18 (b) FUNDING.—Section 4004(e)(1) of the Supple-  
19 mental Appropriations Act, 2008 (Public Law 110–252;  
20 26 U.S.C. 3304 note) is amended—

21 (1) in subparagraph (D), by striking “and” at  
22 the end; and

23 (2) by inserting after subparagraph (E) the fol-  
24 lowing:

1           “(F) the amendments made by section  
2           2(a)(1) of the Protecting Against Indebting our  
3           Descendants through Fully Offset Relief (PAID  
4           FOR) Temporary Extension Act of 2010; and”.

5           (c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by  
6 this section shall take effect as if included in the enact-  
7 ment of the Continuing Extension Act of 2010 (Public  
8 Law 111–157).

9       **SEC. 3. EXTENSION AND IMPROVEMENT OF PREMIUM AS-**  
10                               **SISTANCE FOR COBRA BENEFITS.**

11           (a) EXTENSION OF ELIGIBILITY PERIOD.—Sub-  
12 section (a)(3)(A) of section 3001 of division B of the  
13 American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (Public  
14 Law 111–5), as amended by section 3(a) of the Con-  
15 tinuing Extension Act of 2010 (Public Law 111–157), is  
16 amended by striking “May 31, 2010” and inserting “June  
17 30, 2010”.

18           (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by  
19 this section shall take effect as if included in the provisions  
20 of section 3001 of division B of the American Recovery  
21 and Reinvestment Act of 2009.

22       **SEC. 4. INCREASE IN THE MEDICARE PHYSICIAN PAYMENT**  
23                               **UPDATE.**

24           Paragraph (10) of section 1848(d) of the Social Secu-  
25 rity Act, as added by section 1011(a) of the Department

1 of Defense Appropriations Act, 2010 (Public Law 111–  
2 118) and as amended by section 5 of the Temporary Ex-  
3 tension Act of 2010 (Public Law 111–144) and section  
4 4 of the Continuing Extension Act of 2010 (Public Law  
5 111–157), is amended—

6 (1) in subparagraph (A), by striking “May 31,  
7 2010” and inserting “June 30, 2010”; and

8 (2) in subparagraph (B), by striking “June 1,  
9 2010” and inserting “July 1, 2010”.

10 **SEC. 5. EXTENSION OF USE OF 2009 POVERTY GUIDELINES.**

11 Section 1012 of the Department of Defense Appro-  
12 priations Act, 2010 (Public Law 111–118), as amended  
13 by section 6 of the Continuing Extension Act of 2010  
14 (Public Law 111–157), is amended by striking “May 31,  
15 2010” and inserting “June 30, 2010”.

16 **SEC. 6. EXTENSION OF NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE PRO-**  
17 **GRAM.**

18 (a) EXTENSION.—Section 129 of the Continuing Ap-  
19 propriations Resolution, 2010 (Public Law 111–68), as  
20 amended by section 7 of the Continuing Extension Act of  
21 2010 (Public Law 111–157), is amended by striking “by  
22 substituting” and all that follows through the period at  
23 the end and inserting “by substituting June 30, 2010, for  
24 the date specified in each such section.”.

1 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by  
2 subsection (a) shall be considered to have taken effect on  
3 February 28, 2010.

4 **SEC. 7. EXTENSION OF SMALL BUSINESS LOAN GUARANTEE**  
5 **PROGRAM.**

6 (a) APPROPRIATION.—There is appropriated, out of  
7 any funds in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated,  
8 \$60,000,000, for an additional amount for “Small Busi-  
9 ness Administration—Business Loans Program Account”,  
10 to remain available until expended, for the cost of fee re-  
11 ductions and eliminations under section 501 of division A  
12 of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009  
13 (Public Law 111–5; 123 Stat. 151) and loan guarantees  
14 under section 502 of division A of the American Recovery  
15 and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (Public Law 111–5; 123  
16 Stat. 152), as amended by this section: Provided, That  
17 such costs shall be as defined in section 502 of the Con-  
18 gressional Budget Act of 1974.

19 (b) EXTENSION OF SUNSET DATE.—Section 502(f)  
20 of division A of the American Recovery and Reinvestment  
21 Act of 2009 (Public Law 111–5; 123 Stat. 153) is amend-  
22 ed by striking “May 31, 2010” and inserting “June 30,  
23 2010”.

1 **SEC. 8. USE OF STIMULUS FUNDS TO OFFSET SPENDING.**

2       The unobligated balance of each amount appro-  
3 priated or made available under the American Recovery  
4 and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (Public Law 111–5) (other  
5 than under title X of division A of such Act) is rescinded  
6 pro rata such that the aggregate amount of such rescis-  
7 sions equals \$13,000,000,000 in order to offset the net  
8 increase in spending resulting from the provisions of, and  
9 amendments made by, sections 2 through 7. The Director  
10 of the Office of Management and Budget shall report to  
11 each congressional committee the amounts so rescinded  
12 within the jurisdiction of such committee.

13 **SEC. 9. DETERMINATION OF BUDGETARY EFFECTS.**

14       (a) IN GENERAL.—The budgetary effects of this Act,  
15 for the purpose of complying with the Statutory Pay-As-  
16 You-Go Act of 2010, shall be determined by reference to  
17 the latest statement titled “Budgetary Effects of PAYGO  
18 Legislation” for this Act, submitted for printing in the  
19 Congressional Record by the Chairman of the House  
20 Budget Committee, provided that such statement has been  
21 submitted prior to the vote on passage.

22       (b) EMERGENCY DESIGNATION FOR CONGRESSIONAL  
23 ENFORCEMENT.—In the House of Representatives, this  
24 Act, with the exception of section 4, is designated as an  
25 emergency for purposes of pay-as-you-go principles. In the  
26 Senate, this Act is designated as an emergency require-

1 ment pursuant to section 403(a) of S. Con. Res. 13 (111th  
2 Congress), the concurrent resolution on the budget for fis-  
3 cal year 2010.

4 (c) EMERGENCY DESIGNATION FOR STATUTORY  
5 PAYGO.—This Act, with the exception of section 4, is des-  
6 ignated as an emergency requirement pursuant to section  
7 4(g) of the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010 (Public  
8 Law 111–139; 2 U.S.C. 933(g)).

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
