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# A BILL

Making supplemental appropriations, and for other purposes.

- 1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
- 2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
- 3       That the following sums are appropriated, out of any
- 4       money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, and
- 5       for other purposes, namely:

1                   DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE  
2    MILITARY PROGRAMS OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE  
3                   OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE, DEFENSE-WIDE  
4                  For an additional amount for “Operation and Main-  
5   tenance, Defense-Wide”, \$4,400,000,000, to remain avail-  
6   able until September 30, 2025, to respond to the situation  
7   in Israel and for related expenses: *Provided*, That amounts  
8   made available by under this heading shall be available  
9   for transfer to accounts under the headings “Operation  
10   and Maintenance”, “Procurement”, “Research, Develop-  
11   ment, Test and Evaluation”, and “Revolving and Manage-  
12   ment Funds” for replacement, through new procurement  
13   or repair of existing unserviceable equipment, of defense  
14   articles from the stocks of the Department of Defense, and  
15   for reimbursement for defense services of the Department  
16   of Defense and military education and training, provided  
17   to or identified for provision to Israel or to foreign coun-  
18   tries that have provided support to Israel at the request  
19   of the United States: *Provided further*, That amounts  
20   made available under this heading may also be transferred  
21   to accounts under the heading “Procurement” for expan-  
22   sion of public and private plants, including the land nec-  
23   essary therefor, and procurement and installation of  
24   equipment, appliances, and machine tools in such plants,  
25   for the purpose of increasing production of critical muni-

1 tions: *Provided further*, That of amounts made available  
2 under this heading may also be transferred to accounts  
3 under the heading “Procurement” and “Research, Devel-  
4 opment, Test and Evaluation” for the acquisition of crit-  
5 ical defense articles: *Provided further*, That funds trans-  
6 ferred pursuant to a transfer authority provided under  
7 this heading shall be merged with and available for the  
8 same purposes and for the same time period as the appro-  
9 priations to which the funds are transferred: *Provided fur-*  
10 *ther*, That the Secretary of Defense shall notify the con-  
11 gressional defense committees of the details of such trans-  
12 fers not less than 15 days before any such transfer: *Pro-*  
13 *vided further*, That upon a determination that all or part  
14 of the funds transferred from this appropriation are not  
15 necessary for the purposes provided under this heading,  
16 such amounts may be transferred back and merged with  
17 this appropriation: *Provided further*, That amounts may  
18 be transferred between appropriations made under this  
19 heading: *Provided further*, That any transfer authority  
20 provided under this heading is in addition to any other  
21 transfer authority provided by law: *Provided further*, That  
22 such amount in this paragraph is designated by the Con-  
23 gress as an emergency requirement pursuant to section  
24 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency  
25 Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended: *Provided further*,

1 That such amounts shall be available only if the President  
2 designates such amount as an emergency requirement pur-  
3 suant to section 251(b)(2)(A).

4                   MILITARY PROGRAMS PROCUREMENT

5                   PROCUREMENT OF AMMUNITION, ARMY

6         For an additional amount for “Procurement of Am-  
7 munition, Army”, \$801,400,000, to remain available until  
8 September 30, 2026, to respond to the situation in Israel  
9 and for related expenses: *Provided*, That such amount is  
10 designated by the Congress as an emergency requirement  
11 pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget  
12 and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended:  
13 *Provided further*, That such amount shall be available only  
14 if the President designates such amount as an emergency  
15 requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A).

16                   PROCUREMENT, DEFENSE-WIDE

17         For an additional amount for Procurement, Defense-  
18 Wide, \$4,000,000,000, to remain available until Sep-  
19 tember 30, 2027, for the Secretary of Defense to provide  
20 to the Government of Israel for the procurement of the  
21 Iron Dome and David’s Sling defense systems to counter  
22 shortrange rocket threats: *Provided*, That such funds shall  
23 be transferred pursuant to an exchange of letters and are  
24 in addition to funds provided pursuant to the U.S.-Israel  
25 Iron Dome Procurement Agreement, as amended: *Pro-*

1 *vided further*, That nothing under this heading shall be  
2 construed to apply to amounts made available in prior ap-  
3 propriations Acts for the procurement of the Iron Dome  
4 and David's Sling defense systems: *Provided further*, That  
5 such amount is designated by the Congress as being for  
6 an emergency requirement pursuant to section  
7 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency  
8 Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended: *Provided further*,  
9 That such amounts shall be available only if the President  
10 designates such amount as an emergency requirement pur-  
11 suant to section 251(b)(2)(A).

12 MILITARY PROGRAMS RESEARCH, DEVELOPMENT, TEST,

13 AND EVALUATION

14 RESEARCH, DEVELOPMENT, TEST AND EVALUATION,

15 DEFENSE-WIDE

16 For an additional amount for "Research, Develop-  
17 ment, Test and Evaluation, Defense-Wide",  
18 \$1,200,000,000, to remain available until September 30,  
19 2026, for the Secretary of Defense to provide to the Gov-  
20 ernment of Israel for the development of the Iron Beam  
21 defense system to counter short-range rocket threats: *Pro-*  
22 *vided*, That such funds shall be transferred pursuant to  
23 an exchange of letters: *Provided further*, That nothing in  
24 the preceding proviso shall be construed to apply to  
25 amounts made available in prior appropriations Acts for

1 the development of the Iron Beam defense system: *Pro-*  
2 *vided further*, That such amount is designated by the Con-  
3 gress as being for an emergency requirement pursuant to  
4 section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget and Emer-  
5 gency Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended: *Provided*  
6 *further*, That such amounts shall be available only if the  
7 President designates such amount as an emergency re-  
8 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A).

9                   **TITLE VIII—GENERAL PROVISIONS**

10        SEC. 8001. Section 12001 of the Department of De-  
11 fense Appropriations Act, 2005 (Public Law 108–287), as  
12 amended by Public Law 115–141, is amended as follows:

13               (1) In paragraph (2) of subsection (a), by strik-  
14 ing “armor” and all that follows through the end of  
15 the paragraph and inserting “defense articles that  
16 are in the inventory of the Department of Defense  
17 as of the date of transfer, are intended for use as  
18 reserve stocks for Israel, and are located in a stock-  
19 pile for Israel as of the date of transfer”.

20               (2) In subsection (b), by striking “at least  
21 equal to the fair market value of the items trans-  
22 ferred” and inserting “in an amount to be deter-  
23 mined by the Secretary of Defense”.

24               (3) In subsection (c), by inserting before the  
25 comma in the first sentence the following: “, or as

1        far in advance of such transfer as is practicable as  
2        determined by the President on a case-by-case basis  
3        during extraordinary circumstances impacting the  
4        national security of the United States".

5        SEC. 8002. For fiscal year 2024, section 514(b) of  
6        the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2321h(b))  
7        shall not apply to defense articles to be set aside, ear-  
8        marked, reserved, or intended for use as reserve stocks  
9        in stockpiles in the State of Israel.

10                    DEPARTMENT OF STATE

11                    ADMINISTRATION OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS

12                    DIPLOMATIC PROGRAMS

13        For an additional amount for "Diplomatic Pro-  
14        grams", \$150,000,000, to remain available until Sep-  
15        tember 30, 2025, of which \$50,000,000 shall be for re-  
16        sponding to the situation in Israel and areas impacted by  
17        the situation in Israel, and of which \$100,000,000 shall  
18        be available until expended for Worldwide Security Protec-  
19        tion to respond to the situation in Israel and areas im-  
20        pacted by the situation in Israel: *Provided*, That such  
21        amount is designated by the Congress as an emergency  
22        requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Bal-  
23        anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985,  
24        as amended: *Provided further*, That such amount shall be  
25        available only if the President designates such amount as

1 an emergency requirement pursuant to section  
2 251(b)(2)(A).

3                   EMERGENCIES IN THE DIPLOMATIC AND CONSULAR  
4                   SERVICE

5         For an additional amount for “Emergencies in the  
6 Diplomatic and Consular Service”, \$50,000,000, to re-  
7 main available until September 30, 2025, to meet unfore-  
8 seen emergencies arising in the Diplomatic and Consular  
9 Service: *Provided*, That such amount is designated by the  
10 Congress as an emergency requirement pursuant to sec-  
11 tion 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency  
12 Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended: *Provided further*,  
13 That such amount shall be available only if the President  
14 designates such amount as an emergency requirement pur-  
15 suant to section 251(b)(2)(A).

16                   INTERNATIONAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

17                   INTERNATIONAL SECURITY ASSISTANCE

18                   FOREIGN MILITARY FINANCING PROGRAM

19         For an additional amount for “Foreign Military Fi-  
20 nancing Program”, \$3,500,000,000, to remain available  
21 until September 30, 2025, of which \$3,500,000,000 shall  
22 be for responding to the situation in Israel and related  
23 expenses: *Provided*, That funds made available under this  
24 heading in this Act and Acts making appropriations for  
25 the Department of State, foreign operations, and related

1 programs for fiscal year 2024 and prior fiscal years, in  
2 addition to funds otherwise available for such purposes,  
3 may be used by the Department of State for necessary  
4 expenses for the general costs of administering military  
5 assistance and sales, including management and oversight  
6 of such programs and activities: *Provided further*, That di-  
7 rect loans made using amounts described in the preceding  
8 proviso may be made notwithstanding any provision of law  
9 limiting the interest rate charged to borrowers: *Provided*  
10 *further*, That loan guarantees made using amounts de-  
11 scribed in the second proviso under this heading for loans  
12 financed by the Federal Financing Bank may be provided  
13 notwithstanding any provision of law limiting the percent-  
14 age of loan principal that may be guaranteed: *Provided*  
15 *further*, That, to the extent that the Government of Israel  
16 requests that funds be used for such purposes, grants  
17 made available for Israel under this heading shall, as  
18 agreed by the United States and Israel, be available for  
19 advanced weapons systems, of which up to \$3,500,000,000  
20 may be available for the procurement in Israel of defense  
21 articles and defense services: *Provided further*, That any  
22 congressional notification requirement applicable to funds  
23 made available under this heading for Israel may be  
24 waived if a determination is made that extraordinary cir-  
25 cumstances exist that impact the national security of the

1 United States: *Provided further*, That such amount is des-  
2 ignated by the Congress as an emergency requirement  
3 pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget  
4 and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended:  
5 *Provided further*, That such amount shall be available only  
6 if the President designates such amount as an emergency  
7 requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A).

8 This Act may be cited as the “‘Operation Swords of  
9 Iron’ Supplemental Appropriations Act”.
