6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 55 of title 10, United
7 States Code, is amended by inserting after section 1095f
8 the following new section:

1 "§ 1095g. TRICARE Program: limitation of increases 2 to premiums, deductibles, copayments, or 3 other charges

4 "Beginning October 1, 2011, the Secretary of De5 fense may only increase in any year a premium, deduct6 ible, copayment, or other charge to a covered beneficiary
7 for health care provided under the TRICARE program
8 if—

9 "(1) the rates of monthly basic pay authorized
10 for members of the uniformed services are increased
11 for the same year pursuant to section 1009 of title
12 37 or another provision of law; and

"(2) the increase to TRICARE charges is by a
percentage that is not more than half of the percentage by which benefit amounts payable under title II
of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 401 et seq.)
are increased for the same year as a result of a determination under section 215(i) of such Act (42
U.S.C. 415(i)).".

(b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
at the beginning of chapter 55 of such title is amended
by inserting after the item relating to section 1095f the
following new item:
