## A BILL

To require the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency to finalize a proposed rule to amend the spill prevention, control, and countermeasure rule to tailor and streamline the requirements for the dairy industry, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. REQUIREMENT.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 30 days after the  
5 date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator of the

1 Environmental Protection Agency shall finalize the pro-  
2 posed rule as published in the Federal Register on Janu-  
3 ary 15, 2009, beginning on page 2461 of volume 74, enti-  
4 tled “Oil Pollution Prevention; Spill Prevention, Control,  
5 and Countermeasure Rule Requirements—Amendments”  
6 to exempt certain milk containers and associated piping  
7 and appurtenance from the Spill Prevention, Control, and  
8 Countermeasure program.

9 (b) FORBEARANCE.—Until the effective date of the  
10 rule finalized under subsection (a), the Administrator of  
11 the Environmental Protection Agency may not take regu-  
12 latory action against dairy and dairy product producers,  
13 processors, handlers, and distributors under the oil pollu-  
14 tion prevention regulation in part 112 of title 40, Code  
15 of Federal Regulations, related to the exemptions in such  
16 proposed rule.
