A BILL

To amend the John D. Dingell, Jr. Conservation, Management, and Recreation Act to permanently authorize the Every Kid Outdoors program, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Every Kid Outdoors
5 Reauthorization Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. EVERY KID OUTDOORS REAUTHORIZATION.**

2 Section 9001 of the John D. Dingell, Jr. Conserva-
3 tion, Management, and Recreation Act (Public Law 116-
4 9; 16 U.S.C. 6804 note) is amended—

5 (1) in subsection (a)(5), by striking “or home-
6 schooled learner 10” and inserting “or fifth grader
7 or home-schooled learner who is 10 or 11”;

8 (2) in subsection (b)(2)(B), by striking “during
9 the period beginning on September 1 and ending on
10 August 31 of the following year” and inserting “for
11 a 12-month period that begins on a date determined
12 by the Secretaries”;

13 (3) in the heading for subsection (b)(2)(C), by
14 striking “IN GRADE FOUR”; and

15 (4) in subsection (b), by amending paragraph
16 (5) to read as follows:

17 “(5) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—
18 There is authorized to be appropriated for use by
19 the Secretaries in carrying out paragraph (3),
20 \$25,000,000 for each fiscal year to—

21 “(A) provide operational and staff support
22 for the program, including coordination for the
23 National Park Service to provide operational
24 and staff support in carrying out the activities
25 of the program;

1 “(B) promote the program and distribute
2 resources related to the program to schools,
3 youth-serving organizations, parents, and care-
4 givers;

5 “(C) provide transportation services re-
6 lated to the program to schools and youth-serv-
7 ing organizations with the greatest financial
8 needs; and

9 “(D) launch targeted outreach related to
10 the program for underserved communities and
11 children with disabilities.”.

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
