A BILL

To establish the Veterans Advisory Committee on Equal Access, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 *This Act may be cited as the ‘‘Veterans Accessibility*
5 *Advisory Committee Act of 2024’’.*

6 **SEC. 2. VETERANS ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON EQUAL AC-**
7 **CESS.**

8 *(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—*

9 *(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after*
10 *the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of*
11 *Veterans Affairs shall establish within the Depart-*
12 *ment of Veterans Affairs an advisory committee on*
13 *matters relating to accessibility of the Department for*
14 *individuals with disabilities.*

15 *(2) DESIGNATION.—The advisory committee es-*
16 *tablished by paragraph (1) shall be known as the*
17 *‘‘Veterans Advisory Committee on Equal Access’’ (in*
18 *this section the ‘‘Advisory Committee’’).*

19 *(b) MEMBERSHIP.—*

20 *(1) VOTING MEMBERS.—The Advisory Committee*
21 *shall be composed of 15 voting members, appointed by*
22 *the Secretary of Veterans Affairs. In appointing such*
23 *members, the Secretary shall ensure the following:*

1 (A) Four are veterans with disabilities, in-
2 cluding mobility impairment, hearing, visual,
3 and mental or cognitive disabilities.

4 (B) Four are experts on issues described in
5 subsection (f)(1)(A) or the provisions of law set
6 forth under subsection (f)(1)(B).

7 (C) Two are employees of the Department,
8 one from the Section 508 Office and one from the
9 Architectural Accessibility Program, who oversee
10 the compliance of the Department with Federal
11 accessibility laws.

12 (D) Five are representatives nominated by
13 national veterans service organizations that ad-
14 vocate for veterans with physical, sensory, men-
15 tal, or cognitive disabilities.

16 (2) EX OFFICIO MEMBERS.—The Advisory Com-
17 mittee shall also include four ex officio members (or
18 their designees):

19 (A) The Under Secretary for Health.

20 (B) The Under Secretary for Benefits.

21 (C) The Under Secretary for Memorial Af-
22 fairs.

23 (D) The chairperson of the Architectural
24 and Transportation Barriers Compliance Board
25 (known as the “Access Board”).

1 (c) *TERMS; VACANCIES.*—

2 (1) *TERMS.*—A member of the Advisory Com-
3 mittee shall be appointed for a term of two years. The
4 Secretary may reappoint members to the Advisory
5 Committee for such additional two-year terms as the
6 Secretary determines appropriate.

7 (2) *VACANCIES.*—The Secretary shall fill a va-
8 cancy in the Advisory Committee in the same manner
9 as the original appointment not later than 180 days
10 after such vacancy occurs.

11 (d) *MEETINGS.*—

12 (1) *FREQUENCY.*—The Advisory Committee shall
13 meet not less frequently than twice each year.

14 (2) *SUBCOMMITTEES.*—The Advisory Committee
15 may form subcommittees, which shall meet as often as
16 required.

17 (3) *QUORUM.*—A majority of the members of the
18 Advisory Committee shall constitute a quorum.

19 (e) *CHAIRPERSON.*—Members of the Advisory Com-
20 mittee shall select a Chairperson from among the members
21 of the Advisory Committee. If the position of Chairperson
22 becomes vacant, the members of the Advisory Committee
23 shall select a new Chairperson not later than 30 days after
24 the date on which the position became vacant.

25 (f) *DUTIES.*—

1 (1) *REQUIREMENT TO CONSULT AND SEEK AD-*
2 *VICE.—On a regular basis, the Secretary shall consult*
3 *with and seek the advice of the Advisory Committee—*

4 (A) *on improving the accessibility of the*
5 *Department for individuals with disabilities, in-*
6 *cluding improving—*

7 (i) *the accessibility of information of*
8 *the Department, including electronic infor-*
9 *mation;*

10 (ii) *the accessibility of the services and*
11 *benefits furnished by the Department;*

12 (iii) *the accessibility of the facilities of*
13 *the Department;*

14 (iv) *the accessibility of facilities of*
15 *health care providers furnishing care or*
16 *services under the Veterans Community*
17 *Care Program under section 1703 of title*
18 *38, United States Code; and*

19 (v) *the acquisition process of the De-*
20 *partment to ensure that products and serv-*
21 *ices, including information technology and*
22 *information and communication technology*
23 *(as defined in the standards issued by the*
24 *Architectural and Transportation Barriers*
25 *Compliance Board pursuant to section 508*

1 *of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C.*
2 *794d)), are accessible when purchased; and*
3 *(B) for ensuring the compliance of the De-*
4 *partment with provisions of law relating to dis-*
5 *ability and accessibility, including—*

6 *(i) the Americans with Disabilities Act*
7 *of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12184 et seq.);*
8 *(ii) sections 504 and 508 of the Reha-*
9 *bilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. 791, 794,*
10 *and 794d);*
11 *(iii) the Plain Writing Act of 2010 (5*
12 *U.S.C. 301 note);*
13 *(iv) the 21st Century Integrated Dig-*
14 *ital Experience Act (44 U.S.C. 3501 note);*
15 *(v) the Architectural Barriers Act of*
16 *1968 (Public Law 90–480); and*
17 *(vi) such other provisions of Federal*
18 *law as may be that ensure equal access to*
19 *Federal facilities, benefits, or services for in-*
20 *dividuals with disabilities.*

21 *(2) PROVISION OF ADVICE.—In providing advice*
22 *to the Secretary, the Advisory Committee shall, focus-*
23 *ing on the areas of greatest need for the Depart-*
24 *ment—*

1 (A) assess the disability access needs of veterans, the public, and Department employees for
2 full access to the Department's information, services, and benefits by reviewing relevant information,
3 such as filed complaints by people with disabilities or physical assessments of the Department's facilities;

8 (B) provide assessments of accessibility at the Department and the compliance of the Department with applicable provisions of law relating to disability and accessibility; and

12 (C) provide advice on improving accessibility at the Department, including the accessibility of all—

15 (i) communications, including internal and public facing;
16
17 (ii) services and benefits; and
18 (iii) facilities.

19 (3) REPORTS.—

20 (A) REPORTS TO THE SECRETARY.—Not later than two years after the date of the first meeting of the Advisory Committee, and not less frequently than once every two years thereafter, the Advisory Committee shall submit to the Sec-

1 *retary a report that, focusing on areas of greatest*
2 *need for the Department—*

3 (i) *identifies and assesses access bar-*
4 *riers affecting veterans, the public, and em-*
5 *ployees of the Department;*

6 (ii) *determines the extent to which the*
7 *programs and activities of the Department*
8 *address the barriers identified in clause (i),*
9 *including compliance of the Department*
10 *with provisions of law relating to accessi-*
11 *bility law and reporting;*

12 (iii) *provides recommendations and ac-*
13 *cess priorities to improve the accessibility of*
14 *the Department's services, benefits, informa-*
15 *tion, technology, and facilities;*

16 (iv) *provides a description of access*
17 *improvements and assesses the Department's*
18 *implementation of recommendations from*
19 *previous reports of the Advisory Committee,*
20 *including any unmet recommendations that*
21 *remain necessary for improving accessi-*
22 *bility for the Department; and*

23 (v) *provides any recommendations for*
24 *legislation, administrative action, or other*

1 *actions that the Advisory Committee deter-*
2 *mines appropriate.*

3 (B) *REPORTS TO CONGRESS AND FEDERAL*
4 *AGENCIES.—*

5 (i) *IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90*
6 *days after the receipt of a report required*
7 *under subparagraph (A), the Secretary shall*
8 *submit to the appropriate congressional*
9 *committees a copy of such report and any*
10 *comments and recommendations of the Sec-*
11 *retary concerning such report that the Sec-*
12 *retary determines appropriate.*

13 (ii) *AVAILABILITY TO THE PUBLIC.—*
14 *The Secretary shall publish on a publicly*
15 *accessible website of the Department such*
16 *report and such comments and rec-*
17 *ommendations as may have been submitted*
18 *along with such report.*

19 (iii) *APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL*
20 *COMMITTEES.—In this subparagraph, the*
21 *term “appropriate congressional commit-*
22 *tees” means—*

23 (I) *the Committees on Veterans’*
24 *Affairs of the Senate and House of*
25 *Representatives;*

6 (g) ADVISORY COMMITTEE PERSONNEL AND RE-
7 SOURCE MATTERS.—

8 (1) *COMPENSATION OF MEMBERS.*—A member of
9 the Commission who is not an officer or employee of
10 the Federal Government shall not be compensated for
11 the performance of the duties of the Advisory Com-
12 mittee.

1 (4) *INFORMATION.*—The Secretary shall furnish
2 to the Advisory Committee such information as the
3 Advisory Committee may request from the Secretary,
4 subject to applicable provisions of law.

5 (h) *TERMINATION OF ADVISORY COMMITTEE.*—The
6 Advisory Committee shall terminate on the date that is 10
7 years after the date of the enactment of this Act.

8 **SEC. 3. ABOLITION OF INACTIVE ADVISORY COMMITTEE.**

9 Not later than 180 days after the date of the enactment
10 of this Act and before establishing the Veterans Advisory
11 Committee on Equal Access under section 2, the Secretary
12 of Veterans Affairs shall—

13 (1) abolish an advisory committee of the Depart-
14 ment of Veterans Affairs that—

15 (A) was not established by an Act of Con-
16 gress; and

17 (B) is inactive;

18 (2) consolidate two advisory committees de-
19 scribed in paragraph (1); or

20 (3) submit to the Committees on Veterans' Af-
21 fairs of the Senate and House of Representatives a
22 recommendation to abolish an advisory committee of
23 the Department that—

24 (A) was established by an Act of Congress;
25 and

1 (B) is inactive.

2 **SEC. 4. MODIFICATION OF CERTAIN HOUSING LOAN FEES.**

3 The loan fee table in section 3729(b)(2) of title 38,
4 United States Code, is amended by striking “November 15,
5 2031” each place it appears and inserting “November 29,
6 2031”.

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
