## A BILL

To require an independent study and report on the effect of pass-through budgeting on the Department of the Air Force, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Defense Budget Transparency Act of 2022”.

6       **SEC. 2. STUDY AND REPORT ON PASS-THROUGH BUDGETING.**

8       (a) STUDY REQUIRED.—The Secretary of Defense shall seek to enter into an contract or other agreement with an independent research organization pursuant to

1 which the organization will conduct a study on the effects  
2 of pass-through budgeting on the Department of the Air  
3 Force and other organizations and elements of the Depart-  
4 ment of Defense.

5 (b) ELEMENTS.—The study under subsection (a)  
6 shall include the following:

7 (1) For the period from fiscal year 2001  
8 through fiscal year 2021—

9 (A) the total amount of funds requested by  
10 each military department (as set forth in the  
11 budget of the President for each such fiscal  
12 year as submitted to Congress pursuant to sec-  
13 tion 1105(a) of title 31, United States Code),  
14 not including amounts subject to pass-through  
15 budgeting; and

16 (B) the total amount of funds appropriated  
17 to each military department, not including  
18 amounts subject to pass-through budgeting.

19 (2) For the period covered by the most recent  
20 future-years defense program submitted to Congress  
21 under section 221 of title 10, United States Code,  
22 an analysis of the positive and negative effects of  
23 pass-through budgeting on—

24 (A) the budget of the Department of the  
25 Air Force; and

(B) the budgets of other military departments, including the Armed Forces.

10 (B) the actual level of funding allocated to  
11 Defense-wide accounts.

22 (c) REPORT.—Not later than February 15, 2023, the  
23 Secretary of Defense shall—

6 (d) FORM OF REPORT.—The report required under  
7 subsection (a) shall be submitted in unclassified form but  
8 may include a classified annex. Any classified annex in-  
9 cluded with such report shall not be subject to disclosure  
10 under subsection (c)(2).

11 SEC. 3. IDENTIFICATION OF FUNDS SUBJECT TO PASS-  
12                   THROUGH BUDGETING IN ANNUAL BUDGET  
13                   REQUESTS.

Beginning with fiscal year 2024, in the budget justification materials submitted to Congress in support of the Department of Defense budget for each fiscal year (as submitted with the budget of the President under section 1105(a) of title 31), the amount requested for each military department shall include a separate line item that clearly identifies any amounts requested for such department that are subject to pass-through budgeting.

## 22 SEC. 4. DEFINITIONS.

23 In this Act:

1       Government that is not a federally funded research  
2       and development center.

3                   (2) The term “pass-through budgeting” means  
4       the practice by which certain funds allocated for a  
5       military department are subject to the authority of  
6       other departments and agencies of the Federal Gov-  
7       ernment but are included in the overall budget of  
8       the military department despite that department’s  
9       lack of authority over such funds.
