Mr. ISSA (for himself and Mr. JOHNSON of Georgia) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To provide for the appointment of additional Federal circuit and district judges, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the “Federal Judgeship Act
5 of 2024”.

6 SEC. 2. DISTRICT JUDGES FOR THE DISTRICT COURTS IN

7 **2025.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—The President shall appoint, by
9 and with the advice and consent of the Senate—

1 (1) 1 additional district judge for the central
2 district of California;

3 (2) 1 additional district judge for the eastern
4 district of California;

5 (3) 1 additional district judge for the northern
6 district of California;

7 (4) 1 additional district judges for the middle
8 district of Florida;

9 (5) 1 additional district judge for the southern
10 district of Indiana;

11 (6) 1 additional district judge for the northern
12 district of Iowa;

13 (7) 1 additional district judge for the district of
14 Nebraska;

15 (8) 1 additional district judge for the eastern
16 district of Oklahoma;

17 (9) 1 additional district judge for the southern
18 district of Texas; and

19 (10) 2 additional district judges for the western
20 district of Texas.

21 (b) EXISTING JUDGESHIPS.—

22 (1) CONVERSION OF TEMPORARY JUDGESHIPS
23 TO PERMANENT JUDGESHIPS.—The existing judge-
24 ship for the eastern district of Missouri authorized
25 by section 203(c) of the Judicial Improvements Act

1 of 1990 (Public Law 101–650; 28 U.S.C. 133 note)
2 and the existing judgeships for the district of Ari-
3 zona, the central district of California, the southern
4 district of Florida, the district of New Mexico, the
5 western district of North Carolina, and the eastern
6 district of Texas, authorized by section 312(c) of the
7 21st Century Department of Justice Appropriations
8 Authorization Act (Public Law 107–273; 28 U.S.C.
9 133 note), as amended by Public Law 113–235, as
10 of the effective date of this Act, shall be perma-
11 nently authorized under section 133 of title 28,
12 United States Code, and the incumbents in those of-
13 fices shall hold the office under section 133 of title
14 28, United States Code, as amended by this Act.

15 (2) DISTRICT OF KANSAS.—The existing judge-
16 ship for the district of Kansas authorized by section
17 203(c) of the Judicial Improvements Act of 1990
18 (Public Law 101–650; 28 U.S.C. 133 note), is
19 amended in the matter following paragraph 12 in
20 the second sentence (relating to the district of Kan-
21 sas), by striking “32 years and 6 months” and in-
22 serting “37 years and 6 months”.

23 (3) NORTHERN DISTRICT OF ALABAMA.—Sec-
24 tion 312(c)(2) of the 21st Century Department of
25 Justice Appropriations Authorization Act (Public

1 Law 107–273; 28 U.S.C. 133 note), as amended by
 2 the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023 (Public
 3 Law 117–328; 28 U.S.C. 133 note), is amended—

4 (A) by inserting “, the northern district of
 5 Alabama,” after “except in the case of the cen-
 6 tral district of California”; and

7 (B) by adding at the end the following
 8 “The first vacancy in the office of district judge
 9 in the northern district of Alabama occurring
 10 26 years or more after the confirmation date of
 11 the judge named to fill the temporary district
 12 judgeship created in that district by this sub-
 13 section, shall not be filled.”.

15 district of California;

16 (5) 1 additional district judge for the southern
17 district of California;

18 (6) 1 additional district judge for the middle
19 district of Florida;

20 (7) 1 additional district judge for the northern
21 district of Florida;

22 (8) 1 additional district judge for the southern
23 district of Florida;

24 (9) 1 additional district judge for the district of
25 Idaho;

1 (10) 1 additional district judge for the district
 2 of New Jersey;

3 (11) 1 additional district judge for the southern
 4 district of New York;

 5 **OF APPEALS.**

6 (a) 2027.—

7 (1) IN GENERAL.—The President shall appoint,
 8 by and with the advice and consent of the Senate,
 9 one additional circuit judge for the ninth circuit
 10 court of appeals.

11 (2) TABLES.—The table contained in section 44
 12 of title 28, United States Code, is amended by strik-
 13 ing the item relating to the ninth circuit and insert-
 14 ing the following:

“Ninth 30”.

15 (3) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This subsection, and
 16 the amendments made by this subsection shall take
 17 effect on February 1, 2027.

18 (b) 2031.—

19 (1) IN GENERAL.—The President shall appoint,
 20 by and with the advice and consent of the Senate,
 21 one additional circuit judge for the ninth circuit
 22 court of appeals.

23 (2) TABLES.—The table contained in section 44
 24 of title 28, United States Code, is amended by strik-

1 ing the item relating to the ninth circuit and insert-
2 ing the following:

“Ninth 31”.

3 (3) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This subsection, and
4 the amendments made by this subsection shall take
5 effect on February 1, 2031.

6 **SEC. 7. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**

7 There are authorized to be appropriated such sums
8 as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this
9 Act, including such sums as may be necessary to provide
10 appropriate space and facilities for the judicial positions
11 created by this Act.
