Mr. BIGGS of Arizona (for himself and Mr. CLYDE) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, and in addition to the Committees on Energy and Commerce, and Homeland Security, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

A BILL

To prohibit the imposition of mask mandates on public transportation.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Travel Mask Mandate
5 Repeal Act of 2025”.

6 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON CERTAIN MASK MANDATES.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
8 sion of law, no Federal agency shall impose any Federal
9 requirement related to COVID–19 that an individual wear

1 a face mask when utilizing any conveyance (as defined in
2 section 70.1 of title 42, Code of Federal Regulations, or
3 any successor regulation) or transportation hub.

4 (b) LIMITATION ON EXISTING ORDERS.—Effective
5 on the date of enactment of this Act, the order issued on
6 January 29, 2021, by the Centers for Disease Control and
7 Prevention under section 361 of the Public Health Service
8 Act (42 U.S.C. 264) establishing a requirement for per-
9 sons to wear masks while on conveyances and at transpor-
10 tation hubs, as well as any other related order, directive,
11 and emergency amendment of the Transportation Security
12 Administration (including those described in EA 1546-
13 21-01A, SD 1542-21-01A, SD 1544-21-02A, SD 1582-
14 84-21-01A, EA 1546-21-01, SD 1542-21-01, SD
15 1544-21-02, and SD 1582/84-21-01) shall have no force
16 or effect.
