A BILL

To amend the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 to eliminate reliance on the change of address information provided by the United States Postal Service for the purpose of removing ineligible voters from the official list of voters in a State, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. REQUIREMENTS WITH RESPECT TO VOTER RE-**
4 **MOVAL PROGRAMS.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 8(c) of the National Voter
6 Registration Act of 1993 (52 U.S.C. 20507(c)) is amend-
7 ed to read as follows:

1 “(c) VOTER REMOVAL PROGRAMS.—(1) A State shall
2 complete, not later than 90 days prior to the date of a
3 primary or general election for Federal office, any pro-
4 gram the purpose of which is to systematically remove the
5 names of ineligible voters from the official lists of eligible
6 voters.

7 “(2) Paragraph (1) shall not be construed to pre-
8 clude—

9 “(A) the removal of names from official lists of
10 voters on a basis described in paragraph (3)(A) or
11 (B) or (4)(A) of subsection (a); or

12 “(B) correction of registration records pursuant
13 to this Act.”.

14 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—Section 8 of the
15 National Voter Registration Act of 1993 (52 U.S.C.
16 20507) is amended—

17 (1) in subsection (a)(4)(B), by striking “sub-
18 sections (b), (c), and (d)” and inserting “subsections
19 (b) and (d)”; and

20 (2) in subsection (b)(2), by striking “sub-
21 sections (c) and (d)” and inserting “subsection (d)”.

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
