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## A BILL

To require the Director of National Intelligence to prepare and make available a report on the wealth and corrupt activities of the leadership of the Chinese Communist Party, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Confronting CCP Ma-  
5 lign Influence Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. REPORT ON WEALTH AND CORRUPT ACTIVITIES OF**  
2 **THE LEADERSHIP OF THE CHINESE COM-**  
3 **MUNIST PARTY.**

4 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—Not later than 90 days after the  
5 date of the enactment of this Act, the Director of National  
6 Intelligence, in consultation with the Secretary of State,  
7 shall prepare and make available to the public an unclassi-  
8 fied report on the wealth and corrupt activities of the lead-  
9 ership of the Chinese Communist Party, including the  
10 General Secretary of the Chinese Communist Party and  
11 senior leadership officials in the Central Committee, the  
12 Politburo, the Politburo Standing Committee, and any  
13 other regional Party Secretaries.

14 (b) **HEARING REQUIREMENT.**—Not later than 180  
15 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Direc-  
16 tor of National Intelligence, or the Director's designee,  
17 shall appear before the Permanent Select Committee on  
18 Intelligence of the House of Representatives and the Se-  
19 lect Committee on Intelligence of the Senate to present  
20 testimony in an open hearing regarding the findings of  
21 the report required under subsection (a).

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
