To award a Congressional Gold Medal to Jens Stoltenberg, in recognition of his contributions to the security, unity, and defense of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization.

Mr. DUNN of Florida (for himself, Mr. TURNER, Mr. CONNOLLY, Mr. LARSEN of Washington, Mr. MEEKS, Ms. SÁNCHEZ, Mr. BOYLE of Pennsylvania, Mr. FITZPATRICK, Mr. GUTHRIE, Mr. NORCROSS, and Mr. MCCORMICK) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Financial Services

A BILL

To award a Congressional Gold Medal to Jens Stoltenberg, in recognition of his contributions to the security, unity, and defense of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the “Secretary General Jens
5 Stoltenberg Congressional Gold Medal Act”.

6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

7 Congress finds the following:

1 (1) Jens Stoltenberg served as the Prime Minister
2 of Norway from 2000 to 2001 and 2005 to
3 2013.

4 (2) Norway was a founding member of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (referred to in
5 this Act as “NATO”) on April 4, 1949.

6 (3) As Prime Minister of Norway, Jens Stoltenberg oversaw Norway’s increased defense
7 spending levels and the modernization of the Norwegian Armed Forces.

8 (4) A primary objective of NATO is to provide security and support to member nations and promote democratic values to ensure stability and
9 peace.

10 (5) Jens Stoltenberg assumed the position of Secretary General of NATO in October 2014.

11 (6) The United States was the first NATO member to support Jens Stoltenberg’s appointment
12 as Secretary General.

13 (7) Jens Stoltenberg has led NATO through significant new investments, reinforced its capabilities and enhanced the collective defense of the Alliance.

14 (8) Jens Stoltenberg has advocated for greater burden sharing among members of the NATO Alli-

1 ance, and under his leadership the Alliance will see
2 23 member countries reach or exceed the 2 percent
3 defense spending commitment by 2024, compared to
4 4 member countries in 2014.

5 (9) Jens Stoltenberg's commitment to better
6 burden sharing has resulted in a stronger and more
7 sustainable Alliance than at any other time in
8 NATO history.

9 (10) Under Jens Stoltenberg's leadership,
10 NATO has successfully undergone multiple enlarge-
11 ment periods and has extended membership to Fin-
12 land, Montenegro, North Macedonia and Sweden.

13 (11) In addition to bolstering the collective se-
14 curity of the Alliance, NATO enlargement indicates
15 that an increasing number of countries are meeting
16 key benchmarks on the military, political and legal
17 requirements needed for NATO accession, enhancing
18 interoperability, defense expenditure and intelligence
19 sharing among member countries.

20 (12) Jens Stoltenberg has increased NATO's
21 partnerships with Indo-Pacific countries to cooperate
22 more closely to address our shared global challenges
23 including cyber defense, emergency technologies, and
24 the multitude of challenges posed by the People's
25 Republic of China.

23 (18) Jens Stoltenberg is the second longest-
24 serving Secretary General, serving over 9 years in
25 this position.

6 SEC. 3. CONGRESSIONAL GOLD MEDAL.

7 (a) AWARD AUTHORIZED.—The Speaker of the
8 House of Representatives and the President pro tempore
9 of the Senate shall make appropriate arrangements for the
10 award, on behalf of the Congress, of a single gold medal
11 of appropriate design to Jens Stoltenberg, in recognition
12 of his contributions to the security, unity, and defense of
13 the North Atlantic Treaty Organization.

14 (b) DESIGN AND STRIKING.—For purposes of the
15 award referred to in subsection (a), the Secretary of the
16 Treasury (referred to in this Act as the “Secretary”) shall
17 strike a gold medal with suitable emblems, devices, and
18 inscriptions, to be determined by the Secretary. The de-
19 sign shall bear an inscription of the name of Jens
20 Stoltenberg.

21 SEC. 4. DUPLICATE MEDALS.

22 The Secretary may strike and sell duplicates in
23 bronze of the gold medal struck under section 3, at a price
24 sufficient to cover the costs of the medals, including labor,
25 materials, dies, use of machinery, and overhead expenses.

1 SEC. 5. STATUS OF MEDALS.

(a) NATIONAL MEDALS.—Medals struck under this Act are national medals for purposes of chapter 51 of title 31, United States Code.

5 (b) NUMISMATIC ITEMS.—For purposes of sections
6 5134 and 5136 of title 31, United States Code, all medals
7 struck under this Act shall be considered to be numismatic
8 items.

9 SEC. 6. AUTHORITY TO USE FUND AMOUNTS; PROCEEDS OF
10 SALE.

11 (a) AUTHORITY TO USE FUND AMOUNTS.—There is
12 authorized to be charged against the United States Mint
13 Public Enterprise Fund such amounts as may be nec-
14 essary to pay for the costs of the medals struck under
15 this Act.

16 (b) PROCEEDS OF SALES.—Amounts received from
17 the sale of duplicate bronze medals authorized under sec-
18 tion 4 shall be deposited into the United States Mint Pub-
19 lic Enterprise Fund.
