A BILL

To provide that weighted sleep products for infants shall be considered banned hazardous products under section 8 of the Consumer Product Safety Act, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Safeguarding Infants
5 from Dangerous Sleep Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. BANNING OF WEIGHTED SLEEP PRODUCTS FOR IN-**
2 **FANTS.**

3 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—A weighted sleep product for in-
4 fants, regardless of the date of manufacture, shall be con-
5 sidered a banned hazardous product under section 8 of
6 the Consumer Product Safety Act (15 U.S.C. 2057).

7 (b) **WEIGHTED SLEEP PRODUCT FOR INFANTS DE-**
8 **FINED.**—In this section, the term “weighted sleep product
9 for infants” means a wearable blanket, sleep sack, swad-
10 dle, or similar product that—

11 (1) is sold, offered for sale, manufactured for
12 sale, distributed in commerce, or imported into the
13 United States;

14 (2) is to be placed on or worn by an infant up
15 to 1 year old; and

16 (3) includes materials that add weight to the
17 product for a purpose other than insulation or deco-
18 ration.

19 (c) **REGULATIONS.**—The Consumer Product Safety
20 Commission may promulgate, under section 553 of title
21 5, United States Code, regulations to define, or modify
22 the definitions of, terms used in this Act.

23 (d) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—This Act shall take effect on
24 the date that is 180 days after the date of the enactment
25 of this Act.
