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## A BILL

To amend title 38, United States Code, to extend certain expiring provisions of law, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-  
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

**3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; TABLE OF CONTENTS.**

4       (a) SHORT TITLE.—This Act may be cited as the  
5 “VA Extenders Act of 2024”.

6       (b) TABLE OF CONTENTS.—The table of contents for

15     under paragraph (1) by not later than January 1 of the  
16     fiscal year beginning after the fiscal year covered by the  
17     report.

18          “(h) INFORMATION PROVIDED UPON CONGRES-  
19      SIONAL REQUEST.—The Secretary shall, upon the request  
20      of the Chair, Vice Chair, or Ranking Member, of an appro-  
21      priate congressional committee, provide to such appro-  
22      priate congressional committee documents, records, or  
23      other information in the format specified by such com-  
24      mittee, including testimony, with respect to any allocation,  
25      purpose, use, or activities of the Fund.
