A BILL

To extend the program of block grants to States for temporary assistance for needy families and related programs through December 31, 2013.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “TANF Extension Act
5 of 2013”.

1 **SEC. 2. EXTENSION OF THE TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE FOR**
2 **NEEDY FAMILIES PROGRAM AND RELATED**
3 **PROGRAMS THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2013.**

4 Activities authorized by part A of title IV and section
5 1108(b) of the Social Security Act (other than under sec-
6 tion 403(b) of such Act) shall continue through December
7 31, 2013, in the manner authorized for fiscal year 2012,
8 and out of any money in the Treasury of the United States
9 not otherwise appropriated, there are hereby appropriated
10 such sums as may be necessary for such purpose. Grants
11 and payments may be made pursuant to this authority on
12 a quarterly basis through the first quarter of fiscal year
13 2014 at the level provided for such activities for the cor-
14 responding quarter of fiscal year 2012.

15 **SEC. 3. BUDGETARY EFFECTS.**

16 The budgetary effects of this Act, for the purpose of
17 complying with the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010,
18 shall be determined by reference to the latest statement
19 titled “Budgetary Effects of PAYGO Legislation” for this
20 Act, submitted for printing in the Congressional Record
21 by the Chairman of the Senate Budget Committee, pro-
22 vided that such statement has been submitted prior to the
23 vote on passage.

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
