A BILL

To prohibit Federal funds from being made available to entities that refuse to provide treatment based on COVID–19 vaccination status.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “COVID–19 Vaccina-
5 tion Non-Discrimination Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON FEDERAL FUNDS FOR ENTITIES**
2 **THAT REFUSE TO PROVIDE TREATMENT**
3 **BASED ON COVID-19 VACCINATION STATUS.**

4 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, no funds
5 authorized or appropriated by Federal law, and none of
6 the funds in any trust fund to which funds are authorized
7 or appropriated by Federal law, including funds provided
8 under titles XVIII, XIX, and XXI of the Social Security
9 Act (42 U.S.C. 1395 et seq.; 1396 et seq.; and 1397aa
10 et seq., respectively) shall be made available to a facility
11 that refuses to provide treatment to an individual based
12 on the COVID-19 vaccination status of such individual.
