CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the Congress that President Obama's delays in implementing a clear mission for the American space program represent a clear threat to American exceptionalism.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring)*, That it is the sense of the Congress that—

3 (1) the United States has a proud legacy of
4 Human Space flight, including the Mercury, Gemini,
5 and Apollo missions, and the 30-year history of the
6 Space Shuttle;

1 (2) President Obama’s repeated delays in im-
2 plementing a clear mission for the American space
3 program is creating unnecessary job losses and hard-
4 ship across the country;

5 (3) President Obama’s repeated delays in im-
6 plementing a clear mission for the American space
7 program is rapidly eroding our critical aerospace in-
8 dustrial base, which will lead directly to a precarious
9 situation for our national security;

10 (4) the Space Launch System and Orion Crew
11 Capsule were authorized on October 11, 2010, how-
12 ever, President Obama’s repeated delays in imple-
13 menting a clear mission for the American space pro-
14 gram is forcing us to cede our competitive edge in
15 United States space flight capability to Russia and
16 China; and

17 (5) these collective developments present a di-
18 rect threat to American exceptionalism and are ac-
19 tively undermining our global leadership as a Na-
20 tion.
