Mr. SMITH of Missouri introduced the following joint resolution; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing a balanced budget amendment to the Constitution of the United States.

1 *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled*
3 *(two-thirds of each House concurring therein),* That the fol-
4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several
8 States within seven years after the date of its submission
9 for ratification:

1 of war is in effect. The provisions of this article may be
2 waived for any fiscal year in which the United States is
3 engaged in military conflict which causes an imminent and
4 serious military threat to national security and is so de-
5 clared by a joint resolution, adopted by a majority of the
6 whole number of each House, which becomes law. Any
7 such waiver must identify and be limited to the specific
8 excess or increase for that fiscal year made necessary by
9 the identified military conflict.

10 “SECTION 7. The Congress shall enforce and imple-
11 ment this article by appropriate legislation, which may rely
12 on estimates of outlays and receipts.

13 “SECTION 8. Total receipts shall include all receipts
14 of the United States Government except those derived
15 from borrowing. Total outlays shall include all outlays of
16 the United States Government except for those for repay-
17 ment of debt principal.

18 “SECTION 9. This article shall take effect beginning
19 with the fifth fiscal year beginning after its ratification.”.
