1 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
2 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several
3 States:

4 “ARTICLE —

5 “An Act of Congress that increases the number of
6 judges comprising the Supreme Court may not take effect
7 before the date that is 10 years after the date of the enact-
8 ment of such Act.”.
