Mr. STIVERS, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 4596) to ensure that small business providers of broadband Internet access service can devote resources to broadband deployment rather than compliance with cumbersome regulatory requirements, and providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3797) to establish the bases by which the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency shall issue, implement, and enforce certain emission limitations and allocations for existing electric utility

steam generating units that convert coal refuse into energy.

1 *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it
2 shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R.
3 4596) to ensure that small business providers of
4 broadband Internet access service can devote resources to
5 broadband deployment rather than compliance with cum-
6 bersome regulatory requirements. All points of order
7 against consideration of the bill are waived. The amend-
8 ment in the nature of a substitute recommended by the
9 Committee on Energy and Commerce now printed in the
10 bill shall be considered as adopted. The bill, as amended,
11 shall be considered as read. All points of order against
12 provisions in the bill, as amended, are waived. The pre-
13 vious question shall be considered as ordered on the bill,
14 as amended, and on any further amendment thereto, to
15 final passage without intervening motion except: (1) one
16 hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair
17 and ranking minority member of the Committee on En-
18 ergy and Commerce; (2) the further amendment printed
19 in part A of the report of the Committee on Rules accom-
20 panying this resolution, if offered by the Member des-
21 ignated in the report, which shall be in order without
22 intervention of any point of order, shall be considered as
23 read, shall be separately debatable for the time specified
24 in the report equally divided and controlled by the pro-

1 ponent and an opponent, and shall not be subject to a
2 demand for division of the question; and (3) one motion
3 to recommit with or without instructions.

4 SEC. 2. At any time after adoption of this resolution
5 the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of rule XVIII,
6 declare the House resolved into the Committee of the
7 Whole House on the state of the Union for consideration
8 of the bill (H.R. 3797) to establish the bases by which
9 the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agen-
10 cy shall issue, implement, and enforce certain emission
11 limitations and allocations for existing electric utility
12 steam generating units that convert coal refuse into en-
13 ergy. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with.
14 All points of order against consideration of the bill are
15 waived. General debate shall be confined to the bill and
16 shall not exceed one hour equally divided and controlled
17 by the chair and ranking minority member of the Com-
18 mittee on Energy and Commerce. After general debate the
19 bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-
20 minute rule. The bill shall be considered as read. All points
21 of order against provisions in the bill are waived. No
22 amendment to the bill shall be in order except those print-
23 ed in part B of the report of the Committee on Rules ac-
24 companying this resolution. Each such amendment may
25 be offered only in the order printed in the report, may

1 be offered only by a Member designated in the report,
2 shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for the time
3 specified in the report equally divided and controlled by
4 the proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to
5 amendment, and shall not be subject to a demand for divi-
6 sion of the question in the House or in the Committee
7 of the Whole. All points of order against such amendments
8 are waived. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill
9 for amendment the Committee shall rise and report the
10 bill to the House with such amendments as may have been
11 adopted. The previous question shall be considered as or-
12 dered on the bill and amendments thereto to final passage
13 without intervening motion except one motion to recommit
14 with or without instructions.

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
