Mr. Rush submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform

## RESOLUTION

Supporting the goals and ideals of "Black Women's Heart Health Awareness Week".

- Whereas heart disease and stroke are the number one killers of women, and stroke disproportionately affects African-American women;
- Whereas African-American women are less likely than Caucasian women to be aware that heart disease is the leading cause of death;
- Whereas cardiovascular diseases kill nearly 50,000 African-American women annually;
- Whereas of African-American women ages 20 and older, 49 percent have heart disease;
- Whereas only 1 in 5 African-American women believes she is personally at risk;

- Whereas only 52 percent of African-American women are aware of the signs and symptoms of a heart attack;
- Whereas only 36 percent of African-American women know that heart disease is their greatest health risk;
- Whereas more than 40 percent of non-Hispanic African Americans have high blood pressure, which is more severe in Blacks than Caucasians, and develops earlier in life;
- Whereas African Americans are disproportionately affected by obesity;
- Whereas among non-Hispanic African Americans age 20 and older, 63 percent of men and 77 percent of women are overweight or obese;
- Whereas African Americans are more likely to have diabetes than non-Hispanic Caucasians; and
- Whereas the week of February 12, 2018, would be an appropriate week to designate as "Black Women's Heart Health Awareness Week": Now, therefore, be it
  - 1 Resolved, That the House of Representatives supports
  - 2 the goals and ideals of "Black Women's Heart Health
  - 3 Awareness Week".

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
