Ms. SLAUGHTER, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

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## RESOLUTION

Providing for further consideration of the bill (H.R. 1) making supplemental appropriations for job preservation and creation, infrastructure investment, energy efficiency and science, assistance to the unemployed, and State and local fiscal stabilization, for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2009, and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of  
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee

1 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for further  
2 consideration of the bill (H.R. 1) making supplemental ap-  
3 propriations for job preservation and creation, infrastruc-  
4 ture investment, energy efficiency and science, assistance  
5 to the unemployed, and State and local fiscal stabilization,  
6 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2009, and for  
7 other purposes. Further general debate shall be confined  
8 to the bill and amendments specified in this resolution and  
9 shall not exceed one hour equally divided and controlled  
10 by the chair and ranking minority member of the Com-  
11 mittee on Appropriations. The amendment printed in part  
12 A of the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying  
13 this resolution shall be considered as adopted in the House  
14 and in the Committee of the Whole. The bill, as amended,  
15 shall be considered as the original bill for the purpose of  
16 further amendment under the five-minute rule and shall  
17 be considered as read. All points of order against provi-  
18 sions in the bill, as amended, are waived. Notwithstanding  
19 clause 11 of rule XVIII, no further amendment to the bill,  
20 as amended, shall be in order except those printed in part  
21 B of the report of the Committee on Rules. Each such  
22 further amendment may be offered only in the order print-  
23 ed in the report, may be offered only by a Member des-  
24 ignated in the report, shall be considered as read, shall  
25 be debatable for the time specified in the report equally

1 divided and controlled by the proponent and an opponent,  
2 shall not be subject to amendment, and shall not be sub-  
3 ject to a demand for division of the question in the House  
4 or in the Committee of the Whole. All points of order  
5 against such further amendments are waived except those  
6 arising under clause 9 of rule XXI. At the conclusion of  
7 consideration of the bill for amendment the Committee  
8 shall rise and report the bill, as amended, to the House  
9 with such further amendments as may have been adopted.  
10 The previous question shall be considered as ordered on  
11 the bill and amendments thereto to final passage without  
12 intervening motion except one motion to recommit with  
13 or without instructions.

14       SEC. 2. The chair of the Committee on Appropria-  
15 tions shall insert in the Congressional Record not later  
16 than February 4, 2009, such material as he may deem  
17 explanatory of appropriations measures for the fiscal year  
18 2009.

19       SEC. 3. The chair of the Committee on Ways and  
20 Means may file, on behalf of the Committee, a supple-  
21 mental report to accompany H.R. 598.
