Mr. RISCH introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs

A BILL

To require certain agencies to conduct assessments of data centers and develop data center consolidation and optimization plans.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. FEDERAL DATA CENTER CONSOLIDATION.**

4 (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

5 (1) ADMINISTRATOR.—The term “Adminis-
6 trator” means the Administrator for the Office of E-
7 Government and Information Technology within the
8 Office of Management and Budget.

9 (2) DATA CENTER.—

(A) DEFINITION.—The term “data center” means a closet, room, floor, or building for the storage, management, and dissemination of data and information, as defined by the Administrator in the “Implementation Guidance for the Federal Data Center Consolidation Initiative” memorandum, issued on March 19, 2012.

(B) AUTHORITY TO MODIFY DEFINITION.—The Administrator may promulgate guidance or other clarifications to modify the definition in subparagraph (A) in a manner consistent with this Act, as the Administrator determines necessary.

14 (b) FEDERAL DATA CENTER CONSOLIDATION IN-
15 VENTORIES AND PLANS.—

16 (1) IN GENERAL.—

(A) ANNUAL REPORTS.—Each year, beginning in fiscal year 2015 through the end of fiscal year 2019, the head of each agency that is described in subparagraph (E), assisted by the chief information officer of the agency, shall submit to the Administrator—

1 if the center is administered by a third
2 party; and

3 (ii) an updated consolidation plan that
4 includes—

5 (I) a technical roadmap and ap-
6 proach for achieving the agency's tar-
7 gets for infrastructure utilization, en-
8 ergy efficiency (including performance
9 benchmarks such as Power Utilization
10 Effectiveness and use of Energy Star-
11 rated equipment), cost savings and ef-
12 ficiency;

13 (II) a detailed timeline for imple-
14 mentation of the data center consoli-
15 dation plan;

16 (III) quantitative utilization and
17 efficiency goals for reducing assets,
18 improving energy and efficiency, and
19 improving use of information tech-
20 nology infrastructure;

21 (IV) performance metrics by
22 which the progress of the agency to-
23 ward data center consolidation goals
24 can be measured, including metrics to

1 track any gains in energy utilization
2 as a result of this initiative;

3 (V) an aggregation of year-by-
4 year investment and cost savings cal-
5 culations for 5 years past the date of
6 submission of the cost saving assess-
7 ment, including a description of any
8 initial costs for data center consolida-
9 tion and life cycle cost savings;

10 (VI) quantitative progress to-
11 wards previously stated goals includ-
12 ing cost savings (including savings
13 measured on a total cost of ownership
14 basis) and increases in operational ef-
15 ficiencies and utilization; and

16 (VII) any additional information
17 required by the Administrator.

18 (B) USE OF EXISTING REPORTING STRUC-
19 TURES.—The Administrator may require agen-
20 cies described in subparagraph (E) to submit
21 any information required to be submitted under
22 this subsection through reporting structures in
23 use as of the date of enactment of this Act.

24 (C) CERTIFICATION.—Each year, begin-
25 ning in fiscal year 2015 through the end of fis-

1 cal year 2019, the head of an agency, acting
2 through the chief information officer of the
3 agency, shall submit a statement to the Admin-
4 istrator certifying that the agency has complied
5 with the requirements of this Act.

6 (D) INSPECTOR GENERAL REPORT.—

7 (i) IN GENERAL.—The Inspector Gen-
8 eral for each agency described in subpara-
9 graph (E) shall release a public report not
10 later than 6 months after the date on
11 which the agency releases the first updated
12 asset inventory in fiscal year 2015 under
13 subparagraph (A)(i), which shall evaluate
14 the completeness of the inventory of the
15 agency.

16 (ii) AGENCY RESPONSE.—The head of
17 each agency shall respond to the report
18 completed by the Inspector General for the
19 agency under clause (i), and complete any
20 inventory identified by the Inspector Gen-
21 eral for the agency as incomplete, by the
22 time the agency submits the required in-
23 ventory update for fiscal year 2016.

(E) AGENCIES DESCRIBED.—The agencies (including all associated components of the agency) described in this paragraph are the—

- (i) Department of Agriculture;
 - (ii) Department of Commerce;
 - (iii) Department of Defense;
 - (iv) Department of Education;
 - (v) Department of Energy;
 - (vi) Department of Health and Human Services;
 - (vii) Department of Homeland Security;
 - (viii) Department of Housing and Urban Development;
 - (ix) Department of the Interior;
 - (x) Department of Justice;
 - (xi) Department of Labor;
 - (xii) Department of State;
 - (xiii) Department of Transportation;
 - (xiv) Department of Treasury;
 - (xv) Department of Veterans Affairs;
 - (xvi) Environmental Protection Agency;
 - (xvii) General Services Administration;

(xviii) National Aeronautics and Space Administration;

(xix) National Science Foundation;

4 (xx) Nuclear Regulatory Commission;

7 (xxii) Small Business Administration;

8 (xxiii) Social Security Administration;

9 and

(xxiv) United States Agency for International Development.

(A) establish the deadline, on an annual basis, for agencies to submit information under this section;

(B) ensure that each certification submitted under paragraph (1)(C) and each agency consolidation plan submitted under paragraph (1)(A)(ii) is made available in a timely manner to the general public;

(C) review the plans submitted under paragraph (1) to determine whether each plan is comprehensive and complete;

(D) monitor the implementation of the data center consolidation plan of each agency described in paragraph (1)(A)(ii); and

(E) update the cumulative cost savings projection on an annual basis as the savings are realized through the implementation of the agency plans.

(3) COST SAVING GOAL AND UPDATES FOR CONGRESS.—

(A) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the date of enactment of this Act, or by September 30th of fiscal year 2015, whichever is later, the Administrator shall develop and publish a goal for the total amount of

1 planned cost savings by the Federal Govern-
2 ment through the Federal Data Center Consoli-
3 dation Initiative during the 5-year period begin-
4 ning on the date of enactment of this Act,
5 which shall include a breakdown on a year-by-
6 year basis of the projected savings.

7 (B) ANNUAL UPDATE.—

(I) whether each agency has in fact submitted a comprehensive asset inventory;

(II) whether each agency has submitted a comprehensive consolidation plan with the key elements described in paragraph (1)(A)(ii); and

(III) the progress, if any, of each agency on implementing the consolidation plan of the agency.

(iii) REQUEST FOR REPORTS.—Upon request from the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs of the Senate or the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform of the House of Representatives, the head of an agency described in paragraph (1)(E) or the Director of the Office of Management and Budget shall submit to the requesting committee any report or information submitted to the Office of Management and Budget for the purpose of preparing a report required under clause (i) or an updated progress report required under clause (ii).

1 (4) GAO REVIEW.—The Comptroller General of
2 the United States shall, on an annual basis, publish
3 a report on—

4 (A) the quality and completeness of each
5 agency's asset inventory and consolidation plans
6 required under paragraph (1)(A);

7 (B) each agency's progress on implementa-
8 tion of the consolidation plans submitted under
9 paragraph (1)(A);

10 (C) overall planned and actual cost savings
11 realized through implementation of the consoli-
12 dation plans submitted under paragraph (1)(A);

13 (D) any steps that the Administrator could
14 take to improve implementation of the data cen-
15 ter consolidation initiative; and

16 (E) any matters for Congressional consid-
17 eration in order to improve or accelerate the
18 implementation of the data center consolidation
19 initiative.

20 (5) RESPONSE TO GAO.—

21 (A) IN GENERAL.—If a report required
22 under paragraph (4) identifies any deficiencies
23 or delays in any of the elements described in
24 subparagraphs (A) through (E) of paragraph
25 (4) for an agency, the head of the agency shall

1 respond in writing to the Comptroller General
2 of the United States, not later than 90 days
3 after the date on which the report is published
4 under paragraph (4), with a detailed expla-
5 nation of how the agency will address the defi-
6 ciency.

7 (B) ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS.—If the
8 Comptroller General identifies an agency that
9 has repeatedly lagged in implementing the data
10 center consolidation initiative, the Comptroller
11 General may require that the head of the agen-
12 cy submit a statement explaining—

13 (i) why the agency is having difficulty
14 implementing the initiative; and
15 (ii) what structural or personnel
16 changes are needed within the agency to
17 address the problem.

18 (c) ENSURING CYBERSECURITY STANDARDS FOR
19 DATA CENTER CONSOLIDATION AND CLOUD COM-
20 PUTING.—An agency required to implement a data center
21 consolidation plan under this Act and migrate to cloud
22 computing shall do so in a manner that is consistent with
23 Federal guidelines on cloud computing security, includ-
24 ing—

1 (1) applicable provisions found within the Fed-
2 er al Risk and Authorization Management Program
3 of the General Service Administration; and

4 (2) guidance published by the National Insti-
5 tute of Standards and Technology.

6 (d) CLASSIFIED INFORMATION.—The Director of Na-
7 tional Intelligence may waive the requirements of this Act
8 for any element (or component of an element) of the intel-
9 ligence community.

10 (e) SUNSET.—This Act is repealed effective on Octo-
11 ber 1, 2019.
