A BILL

To require the Consumer Product Safety Commission to promulgate a consumer product safety standard with respect to rechargeable lithium-ion batteries used in micromobility devices, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Setting Consumer
5 Standards for Lithium-Ion Batteries Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. CONSUMER PRODUCT SAFETY STANDARD FOR CER-**
2 **TAIN BATTERIES.**

3 (a) CONSUMER PRODUCT SAFETY STANDARD RE-
4 QUIRED.—Not later than 180 days after the date of the
5 enactment of this Act, the Consumer Product Safety Com-
6 mission shall promulgate, under section 553 of title 5,
7 United States Code, a final consumer product safety
8 standard for rechargeable lithium-ion batteries used in
9 micromobility devices within the jurisdiction of the Com-
10 mission, including electric bicycles and electric scooters,
11 to protect against the risk of fires caused by such bat-
12 teries.

13 (b) CPSC DETERMINATION OF SCOPE.—The Con-
14 sumer Product Safety Commission shall specify the types
15 of rechargeable lithium-ion batteries and the types of
16 micromobility devices within the jurisdiction of the Com-
17 mission that are within the scope of subsection (a) as part
18 of a standard promulgated under this section, as reason-
19 ably necessary to protect against the risk of fires caused
20 by rechargeable lithium-ion batteries in consumer prod-
21 ucts.

22 (c) TREATMENT OF STANDARD.—A consumer prod-
23 uct safety standard promulgated under subsection (a)
24 shall be treated as a consumer product safety rule promul-
25 gated under section 9 of the Consumer Product Safety Act
26 (15 U.S.C. 2058).
