Ms. COLLINS (for herself, Mr. WARNER, Mrs. CAPITO, Mr. MARKEY, Mr. MORAN, Mr. MENENDEZ, Ms. MURKOWSKI, and Ms. STABENOW) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions

A BILL

To extend the National Alzheimer’s Project.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “NAPA Reauthorization
5 Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. EXTENSION OF PROJECT.**

7 Section 2 of the National Alzheimer’s Project Act (42
8 U.S.C. 11225) is amended—

9 (1) in subsection (c)—

1 (A) in paragraph (2), by striking “and co-
2 ordination of” and inserting “on, and coordina-
3 tion of,”;

4 (B) in paragraph (4)—

5 (i) by redesignating subparagraphs
6 (A) and (B) as subparagraphs (B) and
7 (C), respectively; and

8 (ii) by inserting before subparagraph
9 (B), as so redesignated, the following:

10 “(A) promotion of healthy aging and re-
11 duction of risk factors for Alzheimer’s;”;

12 (C) in paragraph (5), by striking “; and”
13 and inserting a semicolon;

14 (D) by redesignating paragraph (6) as
15 paragraph (7); and

16 (E) by inserting after paragraph (5) the
17 following:

18 “(6) provide information on, and promote the
19 adoption of, healthy behaviors that may reduce the
20 risk of cognitive decline and promote and protect
21 cognitive health; and”;

22 (2) in subsection (d)(2)—

23 (A) by inserting “, across public and pri-
24 vate sectors,” after “Nation’s progress”; and

1 (B) by inserting “, including consideration
2 of public-private collaborations, as appropriate”
3 before the period;

4 (3) in subsection (e)—

5 (A) in paragraph (2)—

6 (i) in subparagraph (A), by adding at
7 the end the following:

8 “(xi) A designee of the Department of
9 Justice.

10 “(xii) A designee of the Federal
11 Emergency Management Agency.

12 “(xiii) A designee of the Social Secu-
13 rity Administration.

14 “(xiv) A designee of the Office of
15 Management and Budget.

16 “(xv) 1 or more other designees of the
17 Department of Health and Human Serv-
18 ices, as determined by the Secretary of
19 Health and Human Services.”; and

20 (ii) in subparagraph (B)—

21 (I) in clause (v)—

22 (aa) by striking “2 research-
23 ers” and inserting “3 research-
24 ers”; and

1 (bb) by striking “; and” and
2 inserting “, including at least one
3 researcher with demonstrated ex-
4 perience in recruitment and re-
5 tention of diverse cohorts of trial
6 participants;”;

7 (II) in clause (vi), by striking the
8 period and inserting “; and”; and

9 (III) by adding at the end the
10 following:

11 “(vii) an individual with a diagnosis of
12 Alzheimer’s disease.”;

13 (B) in paragraph (5)—

14 (i) in subparagraph (A)—

15 (I) by striking “an initial evalua-
16 tion” and inserting “annual evalua-
17 tions”; and

18 (II) by striking “research, clin-
19 ical” and inserting “research, risk re-
20 duction, public health, clinical”;

21 (ii) in subparagraph (B), by striking
22 “initial”;

23 (iii) in subparagraph (C)—

24 (I) in the matter preceding clause
25 (i), by striking “initial”; and

1 (II) in clause (ii), by inserting
2 “and reduce disparities” before the
3 semicolon; and
4 (iv) in subparagraph (D), by striking
5 “annually thereafter, an evaluation” and
6 inserting “annual evaluations”; and
7 (C) in paragraph (6), by striking “2025”
8 and inserting “2035”;
9 (4) in subsection (g)(3)(A)(ii), by inserting
10 “and reduce disparities” before the semicolon; and
11 (5) in subsection (h), by striking “2025” and
12 inserting “2035”.

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
