3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Crime Victims Fund5 Preservation Act of 2009".

1 SEC. 2. CRIME VICTIMS FUND.

2 Section 1402(c) of the Victims of Crime Act of 1984 (42 U.S.C. 10601(c)) is amended— 3 (1) by inserting "(1)" after "(c)"; and 4 5 (2) by adding at the end the following: 6 "(2) The amount made available from the Fund for the purposes of paragraphs (2), (3), and (4) of subsection 7 (d) shall be not less than— 8 "(A) \$705,000,000 for fiscal year 2010; 9 "(B) \$867,150,000 for fiscal year 2011; 10 "(C) \$1,066,594,500 for fiscal year 2012; 11 "(D) \$1,311,911,235 for fiscal year 2013; and 12 "(E) \$1,613,650,819 for fiscal year 2014.". 13
