1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may be cited as the "Molalla River Wild					
3	and Scenic Rivers Act".					
4	SEC. 2. DESIGNATION OF WILD AND SCENIC RIVER SEG-					
5	MENTS, MOLALLA RIVER, OREGON.					
6	Section 3(a) of the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act (1

9	"(208) Molalla river, oregon.—					
10	"(A) IN GENERAL.—The following seg-					
11	ments in the State of Oregon, to be adminis-					
12	tered by the Secretary of the Interior as a rec-					
13	reational river:					
14	"(i) Molalla river.—The approxi-					
15	mately 15.1-mile segment from the south-					
16	ern boundary line of T. 7 S., R. 4 E., sec.					
17	19, downstream to the edge of the Bureau					
18	of Land Management boundary in T. 6 S.,					
19	R. 3 E., sec. 7.					
20	"(ii) Table Rock fork molalla					
21	RIVER.—The approximately 6.2-mile seg-					
22	ment from the easternmost Bureau of					
23	Land Management boundary line in the					
24	$NE^{1/4}$ sec. 4, T. 7 S., R. 4 E., downstream					
25	to the confluence with the Molalla River.					

1	"(B) WITHDRAWAL.—Subject to valid ex-
2	isting rights, the Federal land within the
3	boundaries of the river segments designated by
4	subparagraph (A) is withdrawn from all forms
5	of—
6	"(i) entry, appropriation, or disposal
7	under the public land laws;
8	"(ii) location, entry, and patent under
9	the mining laws; and
10	"(iii) disposition under all laws relat-
11	ing to mineral and geothermal leasing or
12	mineral materials.
13	"(C) Effect of Designation.—
14	"(i) IN GENERAL.—The designation of
15	the river segments under this paragraph
16	shall not affect valid existing rights (in-
17	cluding rights-of-way and easements) in,
18	through, and to the land designated as
19	part of the Wild and Seenie River System
20	under this paragraph.
21	"(ii) Private LAND.—Nothing in this
22	paragraph requires management of private
23	land within the basins of the river seg-
24	ments designated under this paragraph in
