Mrs. McCASKILL introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation

A BILL

To clarify terms of cooperation between the Consumer Product Safety Commission and foreign government agencies in order to improve safety of imported products, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION FOR FOREIGN GOVERNMENTS**
4 **TO SHARE INFORMATION OBTAINED FROM**
5 **THE CONSUMER PRODUCT SAFETY COMMIS-**
6 **SION.**

7 Section 29(f) of the Consumer Product Safety Act
8 (15 U.S.C. 2078(f)) is amended—

1 (1) by redesignating paragraphs (2) through
2 (5) as paragraphs (3) through (6), respectively;

3 (2) by inserting after paragraph (1) the fol-
4 lowing:

5 “(2) ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS FOR FOREIGN
6 GOVERNMENT AGENCIES.—

7 “(A) IN GENERAL.—The Commission may
8 authorize a foreign government agency that ob-
9 tains information from the Commission under
10 paragraph (1) to make that information avail-
11 able to another foreign government agency of
12 the same foreign government, including a polit-
13 ical subdivision of that foreign government that
14 is located within the same territory or adminis-
15 trative area as the foreign government agency
16 disclosing the information, if an appropriate of-
17 ficial of the foreign government agency dis-
18 closing the information certifies, by prior agree-
19 ment, memorandum of understanding with the
20 Commission, or other written certification, that
21 the foreign government agency will establish
22 and apply confidentiality restrictions that con-
23 form with the restrictions under paragraph (1).

24 “(B) CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in this
25 paragraph shall be construed to prohibit a for-

1 eign government agency that obtains informa-
2 tion from the Commission under paragraph (1)
3 from disclosing that information to a legislative
4 or judicial authority with jurisdiction over that
5 foreign government agency.”; and

6 (3) by amending paragraph (4), as redesignig-
7 nated, by striking “paragraph (4)” and inserting
8 “paragraph (5)”.
