A BILL

To require the Comptroller General of the United States to conduct a study on ways to increase reporting of missing Indians and the effects of substance abuse, including the use of methamphetamine, on violent crime in Tribal communities, and for other purposes.

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Finding and Inves-
5 tigating Native Disappearance Act” or the “FIND Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. STUDY AND REPORT ON REPORTING OF MISSING**
2 **INDIANS AND EFFECTS OF SUBSTANCE**
3 **ABUSE, INCLUDING THE USE OF METH-**
4 **AMPHETAMINE.**

5 (a) DEFINITION OF INDIAN.—In this section, the
6 term “Indian” has the meaning given the term in section
7 4 of the Indian Child Welfare Act of 1978 (25 U.S.C.
8 1903).

9 (b) STUDY AND REPORT.—Not later than 180 days
10 after the date of enactment of this Act, the Comptroller
11 General of the United States shall conduct, and submit
12 to Congress a report describing the results of, a study
13 on—

14 (1) ways to increase reporting of missing Indi-
15 ans, including ways to decrease the period of time
16 between the time an Indian goes missing and the
17 time the Indian is reported missing; and

18 (2) the effects of substance abuse, including the
19 use of methamphetamine, on violent crime in Tribal
20 communities, including crime relating to missing In-
21 dians.
