  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
  - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
  - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Honoring Ezeagwula
  - 5 and Long Act" or the "HEAL Act".

1	SEC. 2. EQUITABLE TREATMENT OF MEMBERS OF THE
2	ARMED FORCES KILLED OR WOUNDED IN
3	LITTLE ROCK RECRUITING STATION ATTACK.
4	For purposes of all applicable Federal laws, regula-
5	tions, and policies, the members of the Armed Forces who
6	were killed or wounded in the attack that occurred at a
7	recruiting station in Little Rock, Arkansas, on June 1,
8	2009, shall be deemed to have been killed or wounded in
9	a combat zone as the result of an act of an enemy of the
10	United States.
