Mr. CARDIN (for himself, Mr. RUBIO, Mr. KAINES, and Mrs. SHAHEEN) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Foreign Relations

---

## A BILL

To require a report on accountability for war crimes and crimes against humanity in Syria.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

**3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Syrian War Crimes  
5       Accountability Act of 2014”.

**6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

7       Congress makes the following findings:

8           (1) On February 22, 2014, the United Nations  
9       Security Council unanimously adopted Resolution

1       2139 recognizing the escalating level of violence in  
2       Syria.

3                 (2) Credible sources estimate the death of more  
4       than 140,000 people in Syria, including 10,000 chil-  
5       dren.

6                 (3) On February 27, 2014, the Department of  
7       State issued its 2013 Human Rights Report on  
8       Syria, which described President Bashar al Assad's  
9       use of "indiscriminate and deadly force" in the con-  
10      flict, including the August 21, 2013, use of "sarín  
11      gas and artillery to target East Ghouta and  
12      Moadamiya al-Sham, suburbs of Damascus, which  
13      killed over 1,000 people."

14                 (4) The United Nations Independent Interna-  
15      tional Commission of Inquiry on the Syrian Arab  
16      Republic reports that pro-government forces have  
17      conducted attacks on Syrian civilian populations,  
18      and have utilized murder, torture, assault, and rape  
19      as war tactics. Anti-government groups have also  
20      committed murder and torture, engaged in hostage-  
21      taking, attacked protected objects, and shelled civil-  
22      ian neighborhoods.

23                 (5) Internationally accepted rules of war require  
24      actors to distinguish between civilians and combat-  
25      ants and that all parties adhere to the principle of

1       medical neutrality whereby both sides ensure  
2       unhindered access to medical care.

3 **SEC. 3. SENSE OF CONGRESS.**

4       Congress—

5               (1) strongly condemns the ongoing violence, use  
6       of chemical weapons, targeting of civilian popu-  
7       lations with barrel, incendiary and cluster bombs,  
8       and SCUD missiles, and systematic gross human  
9       rights violations carried out by Government of Syria  
10      and pro-government forces under the direction of  
11      President Bashar al-Assad, as well as abuses com-  
12      mitted by violent extremist groups and other com-  
13      batants involved in the civil war in Syria;

14               (2) expresses its support for the people of Syria  
15      seeking democratic change;

16               (3) urges all parties to the conflict to imme-  
17      diately halt indiscriminate attacks on civilians;

18               (4) calls on the President to support efforts in  
19      Syria and on the part of the international commu-  
20      nity to ensure accountability for war crimes and  
21      crimes against humanity committed during the con-  
22      flict; and

23               (5) calls for a United Nations Security Council  
24      investigation into gross violations of human rights

1 and war crimes committed during the Syrian con-  
2 flict.

**3 SEC. 4. REPORT ON ACCOUNTABILITY FOR WAR CRIMES  
4 AND CRIMES AGAINST HUMANITY IN SYRIA.**

5       (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days after the  
6 date of the enactment of this Act, and again not later than  
7 180 days after the cessation of violence in Syria, the Sec-  
8 retary of State shall submit to the appropriate congres-  
9 sional committees a report on war crimes and crimes  
10 against humanity in Syria.

(b) ELEMENTS.—The report required under paragraph (1) shall include the following elements:

13                             (1) A description of violations of internationally  
14                             recognized human rights and crimes against human-  
15                             ity perpetrated during the civil war in Syria, includ-  
16                             ing—

17 (A) an account of the war crimes and  
18 crimes against humanity committed by the re-  
19 gime of President Bashar al-Assad;

20 (B) an account of the war crimes and  
21 crimes against humanity committed by violent  
22 extremist groups and other combatants in the  
23 conflict; and

(C) a description of the conventional and unconventional weapons used for such crimes and, where possible, the origins of the weapons.

12 (A) a description of initiatives that the  
13 United States Government has undertaken to  
14 train investigators in Syria on how to docu-  
15 ment, investigate, and develop findings of war  
16 crimes, including the number of United States  
17 Government or contract personnel currently  
18 designated to work full-time on these issues and  
19 an identification of the authorities and appro-  
20 priations being used to support training efforts;

21 (B) a description of the strategy and im-  
22 plementation efforts to ensure accountability for  
23 crimes committed during the Syrian conflict, in-  
24 cluding efforts to promote the establishment of  
25 an ad hoc tribunal to prosecute the perpetrators

1           of war crimes committed during the civil war in  
2           Syria; and

3           (C) an assessment of the impact of those  
4           initiatives.

5        (c) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEE DE-  
6 FINED.—In this section, the term “appropriate congres-  
7 sional committees” means—

8           (1) the Committee on Foreign Relations of the  
9           Senate; and

10          (2) the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the  
11          House of Representatives.
